Lesson Purpose The Sinukwan Festival</p> <p>The Sinukwan Festival rekindles the Kapampangan spirit with a weeklong cultural revival that happens in early December, culminating in a huge street dance parade through the streets of San Fernando, Pampanga, with several municipalities competing to the tune of "Atin Cu Pung Singsing." Kapampangans take great pride in the Sinukwan Festival, which gives them a chance to honor and preserve their rich cultural identity. It offers a chance to pass on knowledge about Pampanga's history, customs, and values to both the locals and visitors, strengthening the sense of continuity and community. With time, the event has developed into a cherished custom that cheers up and celebrates the Kapampangans and helps them get through difficult times like the Mount Pinatubo explosion and the Lahar in the 1990s. 1. Explication

- ***Traditional Kapampangan Music and Dance***

The well-known Kapampangan song "Atin Cu Pung Singsing" sets the tone for the Sinukwan Festival. It is a traditional piece from the Kapampangan people that has been handed down through the ages.

Atin Cu Pung Singsing is a consecrated song for Kapampangan revolutionaries. The ring mentioned in the song represents Kapampangan Aláya. It refers to the intangible, universal, metaphysical, and infinite, also known as life force or spirit. Our aláya, like the ring in the song, is an essential component of our identity. It reminds us of our Kapampangan roots and the need to preserve our culture, language, and everything else since nothing remains of our Kapampangan identity without these.

- ***Costume and Prop Design for the Sinukwan Festival***

The dancers wear brightly colored headdresses (large crowns) with bright, dazzling accessories and costume designs reflecting the region's rich tapestry, enhancing the visual spectacle.



- **Storytelling and oral traditions in the Sinukwan Festival**

The Sinukwan Festival outlines its roots in the Kapampangan god of ancient mythology, Aring Sinukwan, embodying the region's rich cultural heritage. Aring Sinukwan was the god of agriculture, fertility, and singing. The event was a time for people to gather, celebrate the harvest, and express gratitude to Sinukwan for his favors.



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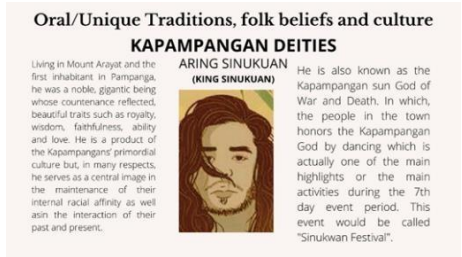
