- 1. Steering Committee and co-chair election

  - b. Committee will begin at the start of the calendar year. Steering committee will establish the term that will be served.
  - c. Laura will create scheduling doodle for steering committee, review charge for committee
- 2. Charleston Conference Update
  - a. Items of interest from those that attended
    - i. Clarity on issue of AI in contracts
    - ii. Continued conversations about a variety of models from publishers regarding OA.
      - Green OA: negotiating for a clean copy rather than pre-pub version.
      - <u>Public access is not equal access</u>
      - <u>https://www.celus.net/</u>
      - Delta Think
    - iii. Charleston Conference was purchased by Annual Reviews.
- 3. Key renewals update (Beth)
  - a. OSO/UPSO: need answers ASAP. Deadline is Thanksgiving.
  - b. Springer ebooks & journals: waiting on new offer for ebooks and databases. Will need a quick turnaround with new numbers.
  - c. Elsevier ebooks: Beth will reach out to Kelly for renewal numbers.
  - d. SAGE journals: variety of models, so Beth will send out individual emails with details.
  - e. Oxford journals: pricing has not gone out yet, but it will go out this week. Pricing will trend down because they have had titles transfer out.
  - f. Cambridge journals: two new subject packages included in the price for Alliance members.
  - g. Wiley journals: pricing has not gone out yet, but seeing around 2% across the board.

- h. JSTOR: Beth will send out individual emails with details
  - i. Concerns with JSTOR licensing. Might be getting mixed messaging from reps.
- i. ACS: currently in multiyear. Ongoing issues with ACS switching the product (C&EN) to an archive model.
  - i. Auraria began subscription in 2016
  - ii. Wyoming began subscription in 1942
  - iii. CMU began subscription in 2016
- 4. eBook OA programs
  - a. Do we want to have a program within the Alliance for OA?
    - i. JSTOR Path to Open
      - 100 monographs in year 1; variety of disciplines; 38 publishers
      - 300 new titles added each year starting in 2024
      - Making books OA three years after publication

        - b. What does the initial license look like? Will they need an initial license and a license post embargo?
