Guidelines for in-text citation format (to be put in your summary)

- All citations in the text should refer to:
 - *Single author*: the author's name (without initials, unless there is ambiguity) and the year of publication;
 - *Two authors*: both authors' names and the year of publication;
 - *Three or more authors*: first author's name followed by 'et al.' and the year of publication.
- Citations may be made directly (or parenthetically). For example:
 - ...as demonstrated (Allan and Jones, 1999).
 - Kramer et al. (2010) have shown....

You will also need to add a section for a “bibliography” “references” or “works cited” (your group’s choice on what to label it as, but must be present below the summary, followed with the citation to the information using the template & example below)

Template of citation of journal article

In the References section, references shall first be listed alphabetically by author(s)' last name(s), and then chronologically.

Last name, A. A., B. B. Last name, C. C. Last name. Year. Article title in sentence structure.
Abbrev. J. Tit. Volume(issue): inclusive page numbers (or start page for epubs).
doi:xxx.xxx.xxxxxxxxxx
