Science and Social Studies are blended into our topics during Calendar, Religion, Math and ELA. We will explore different themes and will update the grid below. During Fundations we will stress fine motor skills in handwriting and work hard at proper pencil grip, posture, and letter formation. We worked on

lowercase letters: f, b, t, m, n, i, u, o, c, a, g, d, s, e, r, p, j, l, k, h, v, w, x, y.... so far. We will work with letters z and qu this week. We'll be ready for Unit 2 after Thanksgiving! Look for an Unit 2 introduction letter after Thanksgiving.

In ELA, we will continue to work on sound words, describing words, action words, writing short sentences, sight words, comprehension, and retelling. In our journals we will write words and short sentences. We will also respond to some ELA stories and Fall/Thanksgiving stories.

A few reminders:

Get Virtus-Certified
