- What realization does Minazad come to by the end of her essay? How is she able to reconcile American and Persian values through the art of cooking?

Discussion Questions for "Swoosh, Swoosh"

- Why is Firoozeh's mother shocked by American cuisine? What, according to her, is the biggest difference between food in Iran and in America?
- What kinds of foods do Firoozeh's relatives try upon coming to America? What do you think these foods suggest about American culture? How is this different from what food means in Iranian culture?
- On page 25, Firoozeh writes that her relatives "picked foods for the pictures on the
 containers, inadvertently proving that American marketing is sometimes better than
 American cooking." How might this serve as a metaphor for the incongruence between
 American media and reality?
