

Special Transport Permit Conditions and Requirements

1. All extra-legal vehicles/loads are required to apply for the appropriate permit(s) in order to travel on any Kiowa County roadways. *CDOT issued permits do **not** exempt operators from being required to obtain a Kiowa County permit. Kiowa County issued permit is not valid on State, City, or neighboring County roadways.
2. Kiowa County follows CDOT guidelines for legal limitations, definitions, restrictions, and holiday travel schedules. (Refer to Rules and Regulations of the Colorado Dept. of Transportation 2 C.C.R. 601-4)
3. Permit applications require a **minimum** of 24 hours for approval. Permits are not valid until approved. Approved permit must be in towing vehicle at all times.
4. Diagram of vehicle and trailer dimensions/axle configurations required with application. (Exemption for oil rigs)
5. All one-time permits will be required to submit payment in full before permit will be approved.
6. A bond will be secured with Kiowa County, if required, to cover cost of damages to bridges and roads. Whether or not a bond is secured, the applicant is agreeing to be responsible for the repair, replacement, or financial cost of/for damages incurred to Kiowa County roadways or property.
7. **Route** must include the last roadway before entering into Kiowa County, the route within Kiowa County, and the final destination.
8. Hauling may only occur between DAYLIGHT and DARK weather conditions permitting. No travel is allowed during inclement weather: high winds, snow, icy conditions, etc.
9. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that the operators of the vehicles are duly licensed and insured according to statute, and that any and all provisions of the law are abided by while on Kiowa County roadways.
10. Applicant is agreeing to take every precaution to protect the traveling public from inconvenience or injury, and protect the roadways, bridges, culverts, signs of Kiowa County from damage. Restricted bridge information may be provided upon request.

Requirements Specific to Oil Rig Operations

In addition to above stated conditions, the following requirements apply:

1. Rig number, well owner, well name, starting section/township/range and ending section/township/range are required.
2. Roadways will be kept free of mud and debris associated with rig operations exiting well site.
3. Annual oil rig permits may be issued to **work over rigs** only.
4. A permit is required for every time the rig is moved onto a Kiowa County roadway. The permit is inclusive of vehicles in direct action of moving the rig and related equipment **ONLY**. Other vehicles such as, water trucks and tanks, well service equipment, mounted equipment, and fracing equipment must apply for permits if required.

Requirements Specific to Construction Project Sites

In addition to above stated requirements, the following requirements apply to oversized loads associated with a specific project site (ex. pipelines, commercial building, etc.).

1. Haul routes will be assigned. Use of unauthorized routes will result in **all** permits associated with the project being suspended or revoked.
2. Roadways will be kept free of mud and debris associated with exiting project site.
3. A weekly hauling schedule will be provided to Kiowa County Commissioners.
4. Project accesses must be approved before any transport permits will be issued.
