The nursery rooms have been having fun acting out the "Red Riding Hood" story, have learnt the related song and have been on autumn walks collecting leaves to make leaf and stick person pictures and wreaths.

The week commencing 21st November the 3 nursery classes will discuss and listen to stories and information about "The Little Mermaid" and do a range of related crafts. Their number is **9**, the colour is **blue** and the letter is **m**.

The children thought of different names for these characters and considered which dwarf they resembled by looking at their own and their friends faces. Apples were cut in half and mirrors used to consider symmetry and these were then used for printing.

Their letter of the week, 21st November, is **v** and they will be exploring the topic related to "**The Gingerbread Man**".

Bulletin words for No 8 - Friday 11 November - Autumn Term 2016

It has been a busy week with the nursery classes making clay poppies for Friday, learning about Snow White, making the faces of the 7 Dwarfs depicting their emotions and creating some wonderful self-portraits showing their own emotions.

The week, commencing 14th November, the 3 nursery classes will discuss and listen to story "Little Red Riding Hood" and the importance of keeping safe. The number is 8, the colour is red and the letter is I.

Transition children have been looking at the story of "Jack and the Beanstalk" and the different versions. They cut out pictures and sequenced the story, made split pin giants and planted magic beans to grow their own beanstalk. They have considered whether Jack was a good boy or not and talked about behaviours. The letter of the week, 14th November, is e, and they will be exploring the topic related to "Snow White and the 7 Dwarfs".

We wish you all a very happy half term fortnight and will take this opportunity to let you know the Thames Valley Police Halloween code:

This Week

The nursery classes have been planting beans as part of their topic related to "Jack and the Beanstalk" so all the staff are hopeful that when we come back after half term there will be pots of gold in the classrooms but no signs of an unfriendly giant!!

As always the children have been busy, busy, busy and they have been learning so much. Numbers are hanging from the ceilings, display boards are filling up and many of their creations go home on a daily basis. The half term has disappeared in a wink but it has been lovely to see so many children settled and enjoying the nursery routines.

Transition children have been using the story of "Goldilocks and the Three Bears" to make masks and act out the tale. They have used their mathematics skills to arrange pictures in size order, have created a wonderful display of the tale by creating bears and their possessions in different sizes and have eaten real porridge. Their messy play this week included wet and dry porridge oats.

The week commencing 7th November the nursery classes will be learning about and discussing "Snow White", and will do a range of related crafts. Their number is 7, the colour is white the letter is k. Transition children will be reading and learning about "Jack and the Beanstalk" and the letter p.

There is no further registration fee as this was paid before your child started with us. For those children who turn 4 years old by 31.08.2017 you will need to register with the RBWM for a state school place for next September.

This Week

The children in the 3 nursery classes have learnt lots about spiders, been on spider hunts around the school grounds, learnt the "Incy Wincy Spider" song and acted it out using guttering, plastic spiders, watering cans and lots of water. The children discovered that the greater the incline of the guttering / "spout" the quicker poor Wincy was washed out!

Transition children were listening to different versions of "The Three Billy Goats Gruff" story. They acted it out with masks and musical instruments representing the goats, made finger puppets of the characters and played with associated small world toys. They learnt some facts about goats so a busy week was had by all.

The week commencing 17th October the nursery children will learn about "Jack and the Beanstalk", sing a related song and do a range of crafts. Their number is 6, the colour is green the letter is j. Transition children are investigating the story of "Goldilocks and the Three Bears" and the letter k.

This Week

The nursery children have been happily creating Humpty Dumpty and there are some "crackingly" good displays in their rooms. I walked into one of the rooms to see jam tarts being hastily consumed, provided by the Queen of Hearts (aka Mrs Freeman)! To add to the "h" letter of the week honey featured on Tuesday as the children were dipping their apple slices into some as they celebrated Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New Year. Enough of the alliteration for this week!

Transition children had a great week looking at the story of "The Enormous Turnip". They retold the story using finger puppets, made a sequence book of the story, held, smelt and tasted turnip and discussed lots of words meaning enormous.

The week commencing Monday 10th October the nursery classes will be looking at the colour black, the letter i, the number 5 and the rhyme "Incy Wincy Spider" whilst Transition children will be learning about "The Billy Goats Gruff" and the letter b.

Bulletin No 4 - Friday 30 September - Autumn Term 2016

What a busy time we had on Open Morning this Tuesday and your children were stars. They managed so well with lots of visitors in their classrooms and were "more outgoing towards unfamiliar people and more confident in new social situations" which is one of the PSE self-confidence and awareness statements in the EYFS.

They have been acting out the story of "Goldilocks and the Three Bears", making bowls out of clay, trying porridge at snack time and generally having enormous fun.

Transition children have been looking at the story of "The Little Red Hen" and managed to retell it using finger puppets and other props. They looked at the process of turning wheat into flour and using real wheat managed to extract the seeds by rubbing it between their hands. They made bread dough rolls which they took home to cook. I hope these were enjoyed by all. The collage pictures they created of the hens are delightful.

Many thanks for supporting our Harvest Festival by donating goods for those in need in our local area which the Salvation Army were delighted to receive. A big thank you goes to Harry Burfitt's mother for providing big sacks of grains and sheaves of wheat which the children explored and we used to display the harvest foods.

We have received a rubberized Jenga game, juggling scarves, a mountain shaped stepping stone

and some small balls from the Sainsbury's Active Kids Vouchers which you kindly donated during the summer term. The children are really enjoying playing with these so a big thank you comes from them.

The week commencing 3rd October the nursery classes will be talking about nursery rhymes and in particular "Humpty Dumpty" and "The Queen of Hearts" and doing a range of related crafts. The number is 4, the colour is pink the letter is h. Any toy coloured pink or related to the topic will be welcome as their "Show and tell" item this week.

Transition children will be discussing "The Enormous Turnip" story. Their letter of the week is h.

Reminders

Please bolt the Nursery gate behind you as you enter and leave for the safety of yours and other children.

With autumn approaching please leave named wellington boots in your child's classroom and send in outdoor clothing each day. We would be enormously appreciative if you helped your child in learning to take off and putting on their shoes and coats. Please avoid shoes with laces as very few children of this age are able to tie them without help. Getting 16 children in each room dressed to go outdoors is very time consuming if they are unable to do this for themselves, meaning we have less time to play!

If your child attends the ballet class on Monday afternoons please provide named ballet shoes which can be bought from Goyals, our school uniform supplier.

Please name your child's lunch box on the outside of the box.

We have a healthy eating policy so please do not send in any nut or kiwi products as these may cause a severe allergic reaction for some children. We have been advised by our paediatric first aid trainers that grapes should be cut into quarters to reduce choking hazards so please do this if sending in these fruits in the packed lunches.

Bulletin No 3 - Friday 23 September - Autumn Term 2016

The nursery children have used face masks to act out the story of the "Little Red Hen", explored wheat and flour and ate bread, used play dough to create loaves for their role play and have been learning the related song. They discovered how to make the colour brown and have created some lovely paintings all related to the "f" sound. Honeycomb children went for a walk around the school, managing the staircases really well and discovering the offices and dining room.

Transition children have been busy this week acting out "The Three Little Pigs" story with a variety of resources, discussing the different versions of the story and the various endings. They have made masks, painted pictures of pigs and investigated strengths of different building materials.

The week commencing 26th September the 3 nursery classes will be talking about "Goldilocks and the 3 Bears" and doing a range of related crafts. The number for the week is 3, the colour is gold and the letter is g. Any gold items will be perfect for their "show and tell" activities. Transition children will be talking about "The Little Red Hen" and the letter m.

A very big thank you goes to everyone who joined in our "Jeans for Genes" day on Friday. We raised £35.00 for this very worthy cause.

Friday is Harvest Festival in the Nursery Department and we would be delighted if you were able to send non-perishable food items and products such as shampoo, soap, deodorants etc. which the local branch of the Salvation Army will collect. We will be collecting from Monday and a box in Transition and one in the nursery hall will be available for your kind donations.

Reminder

With the weather turning wetter and colder please provide named wellington boots, which can be left in the classrooms rather than having to bring each day, and send your child in wearing warm, waterproof outer clothing. The children love splashing and playing outside in the rain but obviously need appropriate clothing. We encourage the development of independent skills so please persuade your children to dress themselves as much as possible. If a jumper ends up back to front do not worry but celebrate the fact that he or she has managed to put it on!

Bulletin No 2 - Friday 16 September - Autumn Term 2016

For our first full week and the topic of "Traditional rhymes and stories "the nursery classes have been talking about "The Enormous Turnip", printing with turnips and other vegetables and acting out the story. They discovered how to make the colour orange by making the playdough.

Transition children have been really busy creating sequence pictures the "Red Riding Hood" story, have acted out the story using puppets and dolls and have discussed the different versions of the story. Miss Green tells me how incredibly well the children have settled in the Transition class, are managing a range of independent skills and have been talking about the "Golden Rules".

The week commencing 19th September the 3 Nursery rooms will discuss "The Little Red Hen" story, the number **2**, the colour **brown** and the letter **f**. Any toy incorporating **brown** would be lovely as a "Show and Tell" item. The Transition children will be talking about "The Three Little Pigs" and the letter "n".

"Every movement counts" is the motto of a new Department of Health campaign to encourage children aged under five to be physically active for at least 3 hours a day.

Recent research undertaken by Loughborough University has shown an alarming statistic that only one in ten children aged two to four is active for the minimum the recommended amount of time. When I walk into our classrooms and outside areas I am glad to say that I observe children who are incredibly active, whether it is developing their gross motor or fine motor skills. In this first full week I have seen children using small spoons to pick up lentils and place them in little containers, making and playing with dough, using writing and mark making materials, transporting sand with a variety of tools, taking part in their gym sessions, moving to music with Mrs Challis, running, climbing frames, riding scooters and the list could go on and on. We are an active rich environment and I am certain the team here are getting your children "school ready".

I feel sure that you encourage physical activity as I hear from the children about trips to the park, walks in the woods and the physical toys they have at home but just a reminder and that is if your child can walk rather than sit in a buggy it all contributes to that 3 hours.

Reminders

We are a "No Nuts" environment as we have some children with severe allergies and this includes products such as pesto and chocolate spread. We have been advised that kiwi fruit is also to be avoided. Fruit such as grapes need to be cut into 4 pieces to avoid choking hazards and avoid cutting foods into circular shapes for this reason for example cut a sausage lengthways rather than across.

Any child who has sickness or diarrhoea **must** remain at home for 48 hours after the last bout.

Next **Friday 23 September** is Jeans for Genes day and the children can wear jeans and their own top (not Nursery one) for a £1 donation.

We have welcomed lots of new children into the three nursery rooms and are pleased to say how well they are settling in. The Transition class children are having a great time too and have had no problems transferring from their nursery rooms. Bulletin No 12 - Friday 8 July - Summer Term 2016

I know that as the year draws to a close I am writing words similar to those 12 months ago but it is true to say that it has been has been another great year. Our EYFS vision to provide an environment that is Stimulating and safe, Tactile and creative, Active and physical, Real and relevant, enabling our children to Shine as independent, successful STARS seems to have produced just that! Seeing the children practising for our annual Sports Day, which unfortunately had to be cancelled due to very wet grass, on the stage at Christmas in front of a huge audience and everything they have done on a weekly basis shows me how incredible your children are. The children are real stars and deserve a very happy and healthy summer break.

With 26 new children visiting the Transition and Nursery classes it is a busy time and we have to say that the existing children have shown great warmth and kindness in welcoming them. The new children are lovely and we look forward to them joining us in September. I am still seeing prospective parents so that the number of new children in September might be even greater! A big thank you goes to you for your wonderful recommendations and the very kind words which many of you have written to us recently. The Nursery children who are transferring to Transition in September have had introductory sessions and have really enjoyed their experiences so the staff are all looking forward to their classes in the Autumn term.

I hope you have noticed the lovely wooden table, bench and stools on the upper lawn by the Nursery entrance. The PTA have once again shown their generosity so very many thanks go to them for all their hard work in raising funds from which your children benefit.

As this is the last Bulletin for this academic year all that remains is for me to wish all the children, parents and my staff a well-deserved happy holiday and for those children moving on to their Reception classes a wonderful life ahead.

Important Dates

Friday 15th July is the end of term and our Nursery Department (nursery classes and Transition) "Fun Morning" to which all children are invited, whether they attend on a Friday or not. We are planning lots of water play outside and the children are likely to get very wet so please provide swimwear, or a complete change of clothing, and a towel. Please remember to provide sunhats and cover your children in sun cream before they come in.

Thursday 8th September the Autumn term commences and we look forward to welcoming you for the new academic year.

Bulletin No 11 - Friday 1 July - Summer Term 2016

The children have practised this week for their sports day which unfortunately we had to cancel due to the very wet and slippery grass which would have made running dangerous for the little ones. Lets hope next year we have a better summer.

The nursery classes have used a variety of techniques to create minibeasts this week such as using clay to create ladybirds, paper plates for bumble bees, paint and foam shapes to stamp pictures of insects and free painting to show their own interpretation of these little creatures.

Transition children have continued learning about minibeasts, their similarities and differences. They have used templates to draw and then cut out minibeasts and have learnt about symmetry as they made butterfly pictures.

During the week commencing 4th July the nursery children will be learning about **the weather**, the colour **rainbow colours**, the numbers **1-10** and the letter \mathbf{c} . Any small toys incorporating weather related items would be ideal as their "Show and Tell" item this week. Transition children will be learning about **minibeasts** and the letter \mathbf{q} .

Request

If you have any clothing, particularly shorts, joggers or leggings which your child no longer wears we would be very grateful for them. We started the year with a decent amount of spare items but they seem to have gone astray and when a child needs changing we are struggling to find something to dress them in. Of course it helps if each child has a spare set of clothing on their peg which is replenished if used.

Bulletin No 10 - Friday 24 June - Summer Term 2016

The weather has not been good this week for going out with clipboards and hunting for mini beasts in the garden which we had planned to help the nursery children with their observation skills and number work but we will try to do this next week. Instead they went on an ant march and they have made 3D models with egg cartons and a variety of recycled materials, and clay mini beasts.

Transition children have continued learning about lifecycles with particular reference to ladybirds this week. Bulletin No 3 Friday 22.1.16

We are so glad that the dinosaur topic is lasting for 5 weeks! The children have had enormous fun creating both large and small scale dinosaurs with the Beehive and Honeycomb children hoping that their huge pterodactyls do not fly down from the ceiling in their rooms! Busy Bees children

have all created individual ones from tubes and paper so the variety of shapes and sizes is enormous. They have created large dinosaur footprints and looked at lots of books, pictures and YouTube clips of "Walking with Dinosaurs". With the very cold weather they have all been rescuing dinosaurs from blocks of ice and creating some wonderful ice pictures.

Transition children have been learning about the characteristics of plant eating dinosaurs and comparing them to carnivorous ones. There is now a giant herbivore displayed next to the carnivore on the Transition wall. Toy dinosaurs have spent the week walking through paint leaving their footprints behind and others have been found frozen in ice and had to be rescued by the children!

The week commencing 25th January the nursery children will be learning about **swimming dinosaurs**, the colour **blue**, the number **3** and the letter **I**. Bulletin words for No. 1 Lent Term 2016

We wish everybody a very happy and healthy 2016 from all of us in The Nursery Department.

It has been a lovely start to the year with children coming in with smiling faces and full of chatter about their holidays and new toys. We have welcomed lots of new children into the nursery rooms and are pleased to say how well they are settling in and they even coped remarkably well with the fire drill on Thursday morning. The new children in Transition are having a wonderful time too and have had no problems transferring from their nursery classes.

Our topic this half term is based on dinosaurs. It would be lovely if you could support the children's learning by talking about this at home.

The week commencing 11th January the nursery children will be learning about fossils and bones, the colour white, the number 1 and the letter j. Any small white item or fossil would be ideal as their "Show and Tell" item this week. Transition children will be learning about meat eating dinosqurs and the letter r.

The Wednesday afternoon activity this term is cold cookery and we are conscious of the legislation regarding allergens. We are aware of children's allergies listed on their medical forms which you will have completed at the time your children joined us but will keep packaging and a list of ingredients used for your information if you require it. We will be making fresh fruit salads on Wednesday 13th January using apples, grapes, satsumas, bananas and orange juice.

We will provide a drink mid-afternoon but will no longer be giving the children the remainders of their lunch boxes at 2.45-3.00 p.m. Many children are not hungry at this time and are going home for their tea. For those who go into "After School Care" then please continue providing a separate tea which is usually eaten after 4.00 p.m.

Although we do not want to discourage children using their own scooters as a means of transport to the Nursery we are no longer going to allow the children to use these on a daily basis within the Nursery hours in our outside play areas. We found last term that the sheer number of these being used at speed was getting dangerous when mixed with other play in the playground. Occasionally we will have a week when these are permitted playground use and I will inform you in the weekly words when this will be. In the meantime we plan to have a variety of different playground activities which we will rotate on a weekly basis.

Young children **need** stories, songs and rhymes every day as an **essential part** of their development so try to build them into your routine.

Sharing these helps to build **loving relationships** and everyone can join in – parents, grandparents and siblings.

Enjoying books helps to build language and communication skills and helps children to learn how to listen and pay attention.

Tell the children how much fun they will have sharing a book with others.

With autumn approaching please leave **named wellington boots** in your child's classroom and send in outdoor clothing each day. We would be enormously appreciative if **you helped your child in learning to take off and putting on their shoes and coats**. Please avoid shoes with laces as very few children of this age are able to tie them without help. Getting 16 children in each room dressed to go outdoors is very time consuming if they are unable to do this for themselves, meaning we have less time to play!

With the weather turning wetter and colder please provide named wellington boots, which can be left in the classrooms rather than having to bring each day, and send your child in wearing warm, waterproof outer clothing. The children love splashing and playing outside in the rain but obviously need appropriate clothing.

Fruit such as grapes need to be cut into 4 pieces to avoid choking hazards and avoid cutting foods into circular shapes for this reason for example cut a sausage lengthways rather than across.

Please leave named wellington boots with your child's teacher as the grass is getting wetter. It would be really helpful if the children could practise putting on and taking off their own shoes and boots so that we have more time for outside play.

Please name all clothing and rename any second-hand uniform.

Any small toys incorporating a frog and black would be ideal as their "Show and Tell" item this week. Transition children will continue learning about **plants and growing** and the letter **n**.

What excitement we had when we visited the Science labs this week and were able to hold the chicks! The children were amazed by how quickly they had grown and loved the tickly feel of them in their hands. We are very grateful to the Science Department for organising this again and inviting us to share the experience.

All the children have made Valentine cards and have been eager in telling us who they love! The week commencing 24 February the Nursery children will be learning about **hexagons**, the colour **purple**, the number 6 and the letter f. Any small toys incorporating hexagons and purple would be ideal as their "Show and Tell" item this week. We are also looking at farms, animals and their young and thought it would be lovely if the children could bring in a baby photo of themselves to show.

Transition children will be learning about colours in food and the letter \mathbf{k} .

Bulletin 5 7/1/14

We've had fun with squares in the Nursery rooms this week, making Elmers out of milk bottles and lovely pictures of the patchwork elephant. Even more exciting was the arrival of the eggs for "Hatch Watch" and when we went over to the science laboratories to look at them in the incubator we were delighted to see that 6 had hatched by Wednesday and 7 the next day. Hopefully we will be able to hold them towards the end of next week. Pictures are on the School website.

Transition have been on an adventure looking for cylinders in the environment and have discussed the properties. Pencil fences, drain pipes and bins were found amongst a lot of other things. Lots of shapes games have been played and musical shakers have been made.

The week commencing 10 February the Nursery children will be learning about **pentagons**, the colour **blue**, the number **5** and the letter **e**. Any small toys incorporating pentagons and blue would be ideal as their "Show and Tell" item this week. Transition children will be learning about **boxes** and the letter **b**.

Reminders:

We have a healthy eating policy and request that snacks for Transition children should consist of fresh fruit, vegetables or foods such as wholemeal bread. Please avoid high sugar, fat and salt foods and no nuts or kiwi products should be sent in because of the severe risk for some children with allergies. Please note that products such as chocolate spread often contain nuts and are high in sugar. Similarly, please send in healthy foods if your child is having a packed lunch and remember to cut foods such as grapes, cherry tomatoes and olives into quarters and cut sausages lengthwise rather than into circles.

Birthday treats, which some children like to give, are wonderful but we suggest items such as fruit as this can be shared at snack time. We generally provide apples and grapes so other fruits would be a real treat for the children.

Any small toys incorporating triangles and red would be ideal as their "Show and Tell" item this week. Transition children will be learning about holes and the letter **m**.

Bulletin 2 17/01/14

"Circle" has been a wonderful shape to start our topic this term in the Nursery rooms. A variety of activities happened such as bubble painting, watches and spinning pictures (those created in a salad spinner) and when we went on our walks around the School grounds the children were enthusiastically pointing to every circle they spotted.

Transition children have performed and acted out "Goldilocks and the Three Bears" as part of their topic on shapes and sizes and have thoroughly enjoyed the experience. They have done size comparisons with boxes and estimated which would hold the most. Their artistic skills have been demonstrated in their pictures of shapes in the environment such as houses.

The week commencing 20 January the Nursery children will be learning about **rectangles**, the colour **yellow**, the number **2** and the letter **b**. Any small toys incorporating rectangles and yellow would be ideal as their "Show and Tell" item this week. Transition children will be learning about patterns and the letter **n**.
