Hands On Science

Before half term, Years 1,3 and 4 were lucky to have Mark from Hands On Science come to school to support learning with our different science topics. For Year 4 they were looking at 'Changing States' between solids, liquids and gases. Mark showed the year 4 children about the water cycle and how heat can change solids into liquids and then gases. We explored the ways we can separate salt from a water solution. Mark brought in a range of different equipment, such as a bunsen burner and gauze.

When Mark came to Year 1, the children looked at forest food chains and created their very own food web out of string. They also explored the difference between cat prints and dog prints, the habitat of a cheetah, and even got to take a plaster cast home!

For Year 3's topic of 'Forces' they had the exciting experience of creating a Mars Rover that had to land safely on Mars. The children were able to use their STEM skills and work in small groups to protect their astronaut (an egg) and try to stop it from cracking when it was dropped from a tall height. Mark from Hands on Science ensured Year 3 had an egg-citing and fun afternoon thinking as scientists.

The life cycle of a Butterfly

In early years our nursery and reception children have been able to watch and observe closely the magical life cycle of a butterfly,

And after waiting patiently for 5 weeks and watching them grow and change from tiny caterpillars to beautiful painted lady butterflies, finally the day came to set them free.

The children watched on in amazement as they spread their wings and took flight across our school playground.

The children were able to showcase their hard work at Elmhurst in the Easter holidays in a show stopping performance. The goal of Chance to Dance is to give a pupil from each school involved the chance to continue dancing by providing them with a bursary to a Royal Ballet accredited dance school in Walsall.
