3 LEVELS OF QUESTIONING A TEXT: Langston Hughes Poetry

Title	Explicit: Right There What did text say? (summary)	Implicit: Between the Lines How did author do it? (writing/literary "tools")	Open-Ended: Beyond the Lines What does it mean? (theme or message)
The Negro Speaks of Rivers	The narrator is describing his experiences on 4 different rivers: the Euphrates, the Congo, the Nile, and the Mississippi.	The poem is a 1st person narrative. It includes repetition such as, "I've known rivers." It also includes repetition of the simile that states, "My soul has grown deep like the rivers." The poem is free verse, for it doesn't rhyme.	The poem's message is that the African American's history is rich and should be valued, beginning with the great Cradle of Civilization, in Africa, in Egypt, and then in America.
