- 4. Refuse to participate, or be a bystander, in any form of bullying as defined above.
- 5. Create a caring environment where everyone feels safe and included.
- 6. Actively engage with our environment to be aware of places and times where there is less supervision, such as the chadar ochel, the hobby wheel, walking to and from activities, during menucha, shower hour, bedtime, GA and meals.
- 7. Support campers or staff who have been, or are subjected to, bullying. Respond to bullying by befriending the person being bullied.
- 8. Talk to counselors, division leaders and/or other staff members about concerns and issues regarding bullying.
- 9. As campers, we agree to tell a counselor, division leader or other staff member if we see someone being bullied.
- 10. As counselors, we agree to investigate and confront bullying behavior every time we become aware of it. We will make an effort to be more visible and alert in places and during times where bullying is more likely to occur. We will do our best to ensure an atmosphere where campers feel safe reporting incidents of bullying and confident they will be dealt with and not ignored.
