#### **Notes**

- The major in Web Design & Development is jointly administered by the departments of Communications and Computer Science. With the approval of advisors, a student may choose whether to graduate with a Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Science (BS), depending on the discipline in which they have taken their capstone.
- Students are required to complete 44 credit hours for the major.
- Simmons requires that all undergraduates complete a minimum of 128 credits of coursework, fulfill PLAN and major/program requirements, and submit a Senior Audit form to graduate.
- You must declare a major prior to earning 80 credits.
