Eligibility

- Student must be in good standing in medical school
- Student must be pursuing a degree at an LCME-accredited medical school
- Student must come from a background that is underrepresented in medicine, defined as the following:
 - $_{\odot}\,$ Racial and ethnic populations that are underrepresented in medicine
 - Socioeconomically or educationally disadvantaged
 - $_{\odot}\,$ Any others whose background and experiences that would bring diversity

Application Requirements

- A complete VSLO/VSAS Application with all institutional requirements
- A brief (< 500 words) summary of why the student is underrepresented in medicine and why they would like to rotate with us

Applications are due 60 days before the start of the rotation. Applicants are encouraged to apply as early as positions fill quickly. Applicants will not be considered until all VSLO/VSAS and Scholarship documents have been submitted.
