**TERMS OF REFERENCE
FOR
INTERNAL REVIEW TEAM FOR THE MID-TERM REVIEW OF THE NATIONAL MALARIA STRATEGIC
PLAN (NMSP 2021-2025) –
(PROCUREMENT AND SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT)**

Background

Malaria is endemic in Nigeria and remains one of the leading causes of childhood and maternal morbidity and mortality in the country. All Nigerians are at risk of malaria due to living in areas with varying transmission intensities. Nigeria accounted for 27% of the 247 million cases of the global burden of the disease or 31% of the 619 global malaria deaths reported in the 2022 World Malaria Report (WHO, 2021). The financial loss due to malaria annually is estimated to be ~132 billion Naira in the form of treatment cost, prevention and loss of man-hours.

The National Malaria Elimination Programme (NMEP), with the support of partners have committed itself to a strategy of universal coverage for all malaria interventions as the optimal approach to malaria control. The current Malaria Strategic Plan covers the period 2021 and 2025 and is meant to achieve a parasite prevalence of less than 10% and reduce mortality attributable to malaria to less than 50 deaths per 1,000 livebirths by 2025. Some of the core interventions implemented by the programme include Integrated Vector Management and its strategies include the use of Insecticide Treated Nets (ITNs), indoor Residual Spraying (IRS), Larval Source Management (Larviciding and Environmental Management) and personal protective measures such as house screening, durable linings and the use of repellents.

Other significant strategies include Malaria chemoprevention and its strategies include Chemoprophylaxis for non-immune immigrants & at risk groups, Intermittent Preventive Treatment in Pregnancy, Seasonal Malaria Chemoprevention – SPAQ as well as the use of Malaria Vaccine and Bio-Technology once they become accessible. Additionally noteworthy strategies include diagnosis, treatment, health system strengthening and other cross cutting interventions. Also, huge investments have been made so far in the National Malaria Control Programme from government and donors in anticipation of a malaria free Nigeria.

In view of the above, the NMEP is conducting a Mid-Term Review (MTR) of its current National Malaria Strategic Plan (2021-2025). The MTR will focus on the review of the malaria epidemiology, entomology, capacity to implement, policy & programming framework, organization, financing, structure and management. The MTR will review the programme performance by interventions, thematic areas. Malaria in humanitarian crisis (emergency preparedness and response), health equity, gender equality and human rights and service delivery levels beginning from the Federal Ministry Level to community level. It is hoped that the findings of the review will provide evidence on the progress made towards achieving national, regional and global targets as well as defining steps to improve programme performance or redefining the strategic direction and focus including revision of policies and strategic plan and the updating of the current strategic plan.

Different categories of experts, both international and national, are required for the MTR, which will be conducted in 4 phases. Also visits would be made to selected states based on some criteria to be approved by the Technical Working group on Malaria (TWG).

Rationale

The MTR requires sound technical knowledge, expertise, experience, collective work responsibilities and coordination. The NMEP, Federal Ministry of Health in collaboration with its Partners is seeking experienced consultants for internal review, under the leadership and guidance of the Malaria Mid-Term Review (MPR) Coordinator to assist NMEP, MTR Advisors, External Review team, Subcommittee chairmen and Roll Back Malaria (RBM) partners to review the performance of each work stream within the thematic areas of the NMEP strategic plan. The consultant will participate in thematic desk reviews; planning meetings and produce a technical report.

Purpose

The purpose of the internal review consultant is to do an assessment of key streams of malaria control in preparation for the external team arrival. The consultant will also be involved in the finalization of the recommendations and reports.

Scope of work

The scope of this input will be PSM – Supply Chain and Quality Assurance/Quality Control. Summarized below are the specific tasks to be carried out by the internal review consultants. The Supply Chain consultant will work in collaboration with another expert (QA / QC) and lead the internal review team on the PSM.

Specific Tasks

1. Receive briefing from NMEP, MTR coordinator and Procurement Supply Management Sub-committee chairman
2. Develop / adapt WHO and finalize guideline for review of background document
3. Review the list of documents and highlight gaps to the MTR coordinator
4. Use the finalized guideline to review PSM background document
5. Analyzing and documenting information on PSM for Malaria control using but not limited to the headings below ;
 - o The current status of program indicators; progress towards set targets;
 - o Major program activities, achievements, best practices and lessons learnt;
 - o Major problems, bottlenecks or barriers to implementation and scaling up;
 - o Level of attainment of procurement supply management (PSM) outcome targets'
This should cover
 - Appropriateness of the PSM mechanisms and processes
 - Appropriateness of PSM outcome indicators (inclusion and appropriateness of PSM indicators included in the NMSP; appropriate phrasing and smartness of indicators)

- Inclusion of baselines and targets for each PSM outcome indicator contained in the NMSP
 - Progress towards NMSP SPM outcome targets
 - Trends of commodities (RDT, antimalarials and LLINs) stock-outs
 - Procurement Indicators – timely delivery
 - Quality Trends - Post-market surveillance of antimalarials; loss rate
 - Enablers and constrainers
6. Work closely with the other thematic review groups and subcommittee as may be necessary;
 7. Develop a summary of not more than 10 pages of the desk review and prepare a PPP to be represented at the entry meeting
 8. Assist the PSM subcommittee to review the generic WHO data collection tools and adapt them according to the gaps identified in the thematic desk review.
 9. Participate in the entry meeting and use comments to finalize summary of the thematic area and data collection tool with the support of the external team and advisors.
 10. Conduct consultations, interviews and collection of relevant data during field visits at national, State, LGA, health facility and community levels.
 11. Work with the MPR team to analyse data and prepare of field reports;
 12. Assist the PSM in scoring performance against standard for Supply Chain Management.
 13. Develop thematic desk review presentation slides and present the in-depth review meeting on MTR findings to the FMOH officials and partners.
 14. Carry out other activities assigned by MTR secretariat and Coordinator.

- Internal desk review summary report and presentation to external review team.
- Draft Data collection tool
- Presentations of recommendations and reports.

- A minimum of 5 years' previous experience in malaria control
- Experience in management, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of health care activities
- Prior experience in conducting program review for Malaria Procurement and Supply chain management
- Well versed with conducting health related desk reviews
- Excellent analytical and report writing skills
- Excellent communication and presentation skills.
