Professional ePortfolio - Senior LEAP

Overview

Project for Senior LEAP is to create a professional portfolio, using an online platform of your choosing, that show-cases accomplishments and experiences. There is no exact "playbook" for creating your portfolio, but you should include a variety of text, images and video. Your portfolio should be engaging and dynamic to the viewer, enlivening you and your experiences in a way that a basic resume cannot.

Your portfolio will serve as a recruitment and networking tool for Senior Mentorship, allowing potential mentors to learn more about you. In addition to helping you secure a mentorship, your portfolio can be a valuable resource for you in the future. We encourage you to maintain your portfolio through college and into your professional career. It is a great modern-day method of documenting your experiences and networking with prospective employers.

Suggestion: one immediate use of your portfolio is to include a link to it in your college applications (in the spaces that ask for you to provide any additional information).

Portfolio Sections

- ➤ Homepage / Welcome
 - Attention-grabbing introduction (be appropriate and creative)
 - Include a professional mission statement of 3 to 5 sentences that states your career goals and the steps you're going to take going forward to achieve these goals. Use <u>this</u> as a guide to develop for your professional mission statement.

➤ About Me

- Brief biography A quick snapshot of who you are. It should only be a few sentences.
 Include a little bit about your personality traits, any unique talents or accomplishments, interests and future goals.
- Photo of you (optional)

> Resume

An up to date resume (see guidelines below)

> For Potential Mentors

- Explain the type of internship you are looking for and why
- It is important that you do not have any personal contact information (no phone numbers, addresses). You may put your email address

> Additional Information

 Perhaps you have an excellent piece of work that you want to show off, a lab report or an essay. Maybe you made a YouTube video for a class. Here is a chance to individualize your page with school related material. Note: There is no need to sign up for a paid account with any of these sites. The basic / free version of these websites are sufficient for this assignment.

Resume Guidelines

> Content

- o Educational background
- Skills
- Extracurricular activities, including community service and leadership
- Awards / accomplishments
- References
- Other related and relevant information, including previous job experiences

> Conventions

- You should not have any grammatical errors
- Your language should be sophisticated

> Formatting

- It should be professionally formatted (there are tons of sample resumes online, pick a style that suits you.)
- It should contain a header (use the school address as contact) and all of the appropriate sections
- Your alignment should be consistent
- o Items should be bulleted or listed
- The organization should be clear and easy to follow

Cover Letter Guidelines

- > This does NOT get linked to your website
- > Hand into Ms. Jensen as a hard copy
- > You may put personal contact information on your cover letter.
- ➤ Here is an example
- > This is for you to hand out to potential mentors that you may be interested in.
- > It should let them know why you want to intern at their company and why you would be valuable to them.
- > This is just a template that you will modify for each potential site.
- ➤ Be sure to tell them the internship is UNPAID and give them the dates (5/16 6/15)

Submitting Your Work

^{*}If you create your portfolio with Google Sites, use your personal Google account (not your @ctemc.org account, because you lose access to it after graduation).

- > Portfolio Copy and paste the url to your website into the Portfolio Dropbox
- ➤ Resume, Cover Letter and a printout of the "For Potential Mentors" page of your portfolio must be turned in hard copy. Put all items in room 102
