EARLY VOTING IN NV ENDED ON 11/4, SO THE DATA BELOW WILL BE ANALYSED BY THE NEW AXIOM POLL THAT CAME OUT TODAY!

Latest Nevada Early Mail Voting as well as Early Voting (which started on 10/22) of 11/7

Note: Data was slightly revised based on mail-in-ballots (reflected below)

2,573 (+29 from 11/6) more registered Republicans have returned an Early Mail-in-Ballot as of 11/6 (+3.8% Lead same from 3.8% on 11/6 (0.0%})

Other (Independents): 13,507 (+3 from 11/6) Total Returned: 67,720 (+16 from 11/6)

48,201 (same from 11/6) more registered Democrats have Voted Early as of 11/6 (6.9% Lead same from 6.9% on 11/6 $\{0.0\%\}$)

Actual votes from the mail-in-process and early voting won't be counted until Election Day. One can assume that Republicans are most likely Trump votes while Democrats are HRC votes. When data is shared on early voting historically, that assumption is used.

NEW AXIOM POLL AS OF 11/3: The good news is that in Axiom's poll released today (taken 11/3), 80% of Democrats are voting for HRC while 85% of Republicans are voting for Trump. 10% of Republicans are voting for HRC while 14% of Democrats are voting for Trump (Very conservative but we will roll with it).

Also, No Party Affiliation (Independents) has been breaking for Trump. In Axiom's most recent poll on 11/3, Trump has 45% of Independents while HRC only has 37% of Independents. If we take Axiom poll's data, the likelihood of the tallies above would translate as following in the votes mailed and early voted so far:

R - 236,819 (R voting for Trump) + 45,393 (D voting for Trump) + 75,217 (I voting for Trump) = 357,429 Total Votes

D - 259,391 (D voting for HRC) + 27,861 (R voting for HRC) + 61,845 (I voting for HRC) = 349,097 Total Votes

Total Votes for either candidate – 706,526

Total Votes for ALL (which I used to derive the %s below) candidates – 769,998

Trump = 46.4% HRC = 45.3% Margin = 1.1 points for Trump

Note: For the first time my %s above will not equal 100% because I am taking into account the following factors:

Gary Johnson – R: 3% D: 1% I: 6%

Someone else – R: 0% D: 1% I: 6% Undecided – R: 2% D: 3% I: 6%
