

The Kings Mountain community is located in unincorporated San Mateo County, primarily along Skyline Boulevard (also referred to as “Skyline” or “Highway 35”) along a corridor bounded by Highway 92 at the north end and extending south as far as Bear Gulch Road West. The community also includes streets that can be accessed from Skyline Blvd. and extend approximately two and one half (2 ½) miles to the west or up to a mile to the east.

This application covers 338 homes in the following portions of the community:

- **North Mountain Zone:** bounded by Highway 92 at the north and extending south to include residents as far south as 13130 Skyline Boulevard and ending at the Purissima Creek parking lot. Zone leaders for this area include William McClenahan (seemacrun@gmail.com) and Doug Forster (dforster447@gmail.com). Based on CERT residence maps, this zone includes 46 homes.
- **Mid-Mountain Zone:** starting at the Purissima Creek parking lot and extending south as far as the intersection with Kings Mountain Road and Tunitas Creek Road. This area includes Henrik Ibsen Park. Zone leaders for this area include Roisin Altreuder (roisinem@gmail.com), Kelly Holcher (km_holscher@yahoo.com), Jack Rix (jrix1727@gmail.com), and Jon Ronneberg (ronnebergjohn@gmail.com). Based on CERT residence maps, this zone includes 218 homes.
- **South Mountain Zone:** starting on Skyline Boulevard at the junction of Kings Mountain Road and Tunitas Creek Road and including homes on Kings Mountain Road and Tunitas Creek. The zone extends south to include residents of Swett Road. This zone also includes residents of Philips Lane, Blue Jay Way, Laughing Cow Road, and Sierra Morena Road. This zone does not include properties on Native Sons Road, Durham Road, or Star Hill Road west of the intersection of Star Hill Road and Swett Road. Based on CERT maps, this zone includes 71 homes.
