*If you haven't already been keeping track of activities, awards, achievements, hobbies, volunteer work, employment, camps etc. that might set your child apart from his/her peers, start the list now. This can be placed at the bottom of the transcript and helps show interests and abilities not otherwise represented.

*Register your child to take the ACT at https://www.act.org

Plan for your child to take this at least twice their junior year.

If your family *would qualify for free or reduced lunch according to income guidelines, you are eligible for up to 4 fee waivers (must be a junior or senior). Contact the public school counselor in your school district and make the request. More details found here:

*Look into and make decisions about concurrent enrollment during your child's Senior year. Typical courses include: English Comp 1, English Comp 2, History, Communications, College Algebra. Courses can be taken online or in person and are typically offered at a reduced price.

Parents of SENIORS planning to attend college should...

*Prepare a transcript, if you haven't already (see information listed under JUNIORS).

*Get a file or folder to place all documents/ passwords/ logins/ etc for the upcoming college prep materials.

*In OCTOBER, fill out the FAFSA (Pell grant & loans; starting point for ANY financial aid) at https://fafsa.gov/

Delay can mean missed opportunities, so do it as soon as possible. You will need your tax information from the previous tax year.

*Fill out Arkansas Youniversal Application (State grants & state merit-based scholarships to attend college in Arkansas) at https://www.ark.org/adhe_financialaid/Login.aspx

This application is for one of two scholarships available through the use of the AR lottery.

1- Academic Challenge: \$1000-\$5000 per year. Application deadline JUNE 30 of the year of graduation. Awards begin to be announced in May. Renewable.

- -submit ACT score (or other qualifying test score)
- -submit transcript (must mail)
- -complete FAFSA by application due date

*Actively look into the college of choice and apply. Many more scholarship opportunities are available to "early" registration candidates. Some colleges even host invitation-only scholarship events to early applicants. Most early decision and early action applications are due between October 1 and December 1.

*Request up to 3 letters of recommendation from teachers, counselors, employers or youth group leaders. Many scholarship applications will request these.

*Write at least three essays on the following topics: What are your future plans, the person you most admire, something you have overcome, and why you need scholarship money. These need to be five hundred words. These essays should serve you well for all scholarship applications. You can tweak these essays to fit just about any application. *Make a list of all of your community service. If you don't have any, you need to log some hours.
