NORTH EAST WAR MEMORIALS PROJECT GREAT WAR COMMEMORATION 6th OCT.

On Saturday 6th October members of the DLI Association attended Saltwell Park in Gateshead to mark the centenary ending of the Great War. The focus of the activity was the planting of a commemorative tree inside the grounds of Saltwell Park, near the wooden bridge that honours the 9th battalion DLI. It was very fitting and appropriate that DLI Veterans of the Gateshead and Newcastle Branch were present, in particular their President Mr Richard Atkinson, Chevalier of the Legion d'Honneur, and their Chairman Mr Tommy Nicholson, as well as members from Gateshead and other branches including Chester-le-Street, Horden & Peterlee, Consett & Stanley, Darlington, Stockton, and Washington. The DLI Association paraded one standard which joined the other standard bearers present to provide a colourful display. Major Paul Wharton MM laid a wreath on behalf of the Association. The ceremony was interesting as it was part of a weekend of events organised by the North East War Memorials Project, Gateshead Council and Veterans organisations. Dignitaries included the Lord Mayor of Newcastle, the Mayor of Gateshead, the French Consul, the Mayors and Deputy Mayors of many French towns and villages including the Deputy Mayor of Ypres, the Mayor of Arras, and the Mayor of Auteuil from the Somme battlefield, as well as a number of French and Belgium Councillors. The memorial service and tree planting was organised by Major (Retd) Ian Jones TD of the

Tyneside Scottish Branch of the Royal Artillery Association. Buglers from the Members of the DLI Association Group at the park, including Dick Atkinson Chev legion d'Honneur, and Tommy Nicholson.

Fusiliers Association played the calls and a Scottish piper, played a lament for the Fallen. A VIP reception at Saltwell Towers was attended by many including Major Wharton, Lt Col Heron and Major Alasdair Watson.
