## **Pre-registration Guide**

### **How to sign up for classes for the Fall 2026 semester**

#### Notes:

This guide is for students who are enrolled at Covenant in the Spring 2026 semester. Online pre-registration for continuing students begins March 25 for seniors who are on track to graduate in December 2026. Other groups register on the days following.

## Step 1: Prepare A Plan

  - Select the Fall 2026 term
    - Your registration time window displays.
    - Resolve any holds as quickly as you can.  
Don't wait until the last minute to address your holds!

## Step 2: Meet with your faculty advisor

- **Things to talk about:**
  - Which classes should I take?
  - Your major, minor, concentration, or certificate. Any changes to make?
  - Am I on track to graduate on time?
  - May Term or summer classes
  - Any other academic questions you have
- **Get your Alternate PIN**
  - You need the PIN to register online
  - Your advisor provides the Alternate PIN code. You must meet with your faculty advisor to get the PIN.
  - The PIN is 6 digits. For example, *123456*.
  - You will enter the PIN on Banner when your registration time comes.
- **Consider Priority Pre-registration**
  - Need a specific section because other sections conflict with sports, health needs, other classes or something else? You may request priority for a specific section of multiple-section classes to reduce conflicts.
  - Multiple-section classes only.
  - Form available from faculty and coaches
  - Examples:

## Step 3: Pre-register on Banner on your pre-registration day

- Login to [Banner](#)
- Click Student
- Click Registration Site
- Click Register for Classes
- Select Fall 2026
- Enter your Alternate PIN
- Click Continue

**Search for the classes that you want to take.**

**Add the classes.**

Your class schedule should include 12 or more credit hours.

Click the  button to save the classes.

**If you do not click the  button, then the classes won't save.**



**Error message appears?**



Sometimes classes don't add to students' schedules successfully. You may need to troubleshoot these issues:

- **Closed – waitlisted:** The class is already full. You can choose to add your name to the class's waiting list. See next page for details.
- **Prerequisite and Test Score Error:** The class requires a prerequisite or test score that you do not have.
- **Time conflict:** Two of your classes meet at the same time.
- **Restricted:** The class may be limited to certain class levels (e.g. Seniors only) or certain majors.

If you are blocked from registering for a class and you believe this is an error, then send an email to the class's instructor, your advisor, and the Office of Records ([records@covenant.edu](mailto:records@covenant.edu)).

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## Also consider...

### **Closed Classes and Waitlists:**

- If you try to register for a class and it is closed, then you can add your name to the waitlist. To do this, you must select "Waitlisted" under the ACTION field on the right of the screen, and then click Submit. If the ACTION field states "None" that means no action has been taken and your name is not on the waitlist.
- The Office of Records staff monitors waiting lists. If a seat opens for you, you will receive an email notification.
- If you are waitlisted for a class, it is wise to pre-register for a different class as a backup plan. There is no guarantee that a seat will open for you in the full class.

### **Changing a class's credits hours or grade mode**

Email the Office of Records at [records@covenant.edu](mailto:records@covenant.edu) to change the grading mode of a class to Pass/Fail or to change the number of credits for variable-credit classes.

Pass/fail grading is available to seniors and juniors who have a gpa of 2.70 or above in their Covenant classes.

Pass/fail is for electives only; not for core classes or classes in your major/minor/concentration, with a few exceptions.

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### **Rising Seniors (current juniors):**

**You will receive a Graduation Application sheet in your campus mailbox. This must be completed, reviewed by your faculty advisor, and turned in to the Office of Records by March 23.**

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# Fulfilling Core Curriculum requirements during the Core transition.

1. **COR 100 The Christian Mind** is becoming **COR 150 Cornerstone**.  
If you will successfully complete COR 100 The Christian Mind by the end of this semester, then don't register for COR 150 Cornerstone.
2. **Global Awareness, COR 340 Christ & Culture, and COR 350 Keystone**.
  - a. Rising seniors should take an approved Global Awareness course and COR 340.
  - b. Rising juniors should take an approved Global Awareness course and COR 340.
  - c. Rising sophomores and freshmen (anyone graduating in May 2029 or after) should wait to take COR 350 Keystone in Fall 2028 or after.
3. **COR 154 Embracing Human Flourishing / HWC 154 Fitness for Life:**  
This requirement has been waived for current students who will not complete it by the end of the Spring 2026 semester. Students who will not complete COR 154 or HWC 154 should update their graduation plans to replace the course with two hours of elective credit.
4. **Humanities, Natural Science Lab, and Social Science** requirements:  
Students must take an approved course from *outside* of his/her major's department.
5. **Fine Arts, Global Awareness, and Cultural Inquiry** requirements:  
Students must take an approved course. It can be from within or without his/her major's department. Students majoring in Interdisciplinary Studies can fulfill
6. **Cultural Heritage of the West I and II**. There are four ways for current students to fulfill the 6-credit "CHOW" requirements:
  - a. Complete COR 225 and COR 226\*
  - b. Complete COR 225 and COR 250
  - c. Complete COR 226 and COR 250
  - d. Complete COR 250 and a 3-credit elective

\*This option must be completed by the end of May Term 2026 since that is the final time that COR 225 and COR 226 will be offered.
7. **Cultural Inquiry and Diversity**. The core Diversity requirement has been replaced by the Cultural Inquiry requirement. If your requirements mention a Diversity course, then you should complete a course from the Cultural Inquiry list to fulfill the requirement.

The Social Science, Natural Science Lab, and Humanities distributions must be fulfilled with a course from a department *other than* your major's department.

The Diversity, Fine Arts, Global Awareness requirements can be fulfilled with a listed course from any department (doesn't have to be a department outside of your major).

A course cannot double-count for two of the above six requirements. For example, a student can use PSY 333 Cross-Cultural Psychology to count towards either the Social Science or Cultural Inquiry requirements, but not both.
