Project Compassion 2024: Frequently Asked Questions

- Do I have to volunteer for the entire week if I want to be involved in PC?
 - No. You can volunteer for 1 day, 2 days, or any time that you're available. Even if you're not available for an entire day, you can sign up to help out for just a few hours. You can indicate your availability on the registration form. We just encourage you to come out ready to serve!
- What kind of projects will I be involved in?
 - Food and clothing donation collection and sorting
 - Meal preparation and distribution
 - Construction site assistance (no prior training required)
 - Landscaping assistance
 - and more!
- What do I need to bring with me to each volunteer/work site?
 - A packed lunch or snack, a water bottle, a mask, closed-toed shoes, and a pair of work gloves (only for outdoor sites)
 - If you forget or do not have things such as gloves and you require them for the project you are working on, don't worry! We will have extras.
- Can I receive community service hour verification with this project?
 - Yes! One of the Project Compassion leaders can fill out and/or sign any community service logs you need.
- Is there a cost to being involved?
 - No! Your involvement is free!
- How can I financially donate to the organizations we'll be helping during the week?
 - If you would like to do so, this is definitely an option. We will communicate donation details closer to the project. This piece of the project is still under construction!
- What about transportation? How will I get to each volunteer/work site?
 - We will help arrange carpools for people traveling from similar areas to each work site each day. If you can arrange your own transportation to and from each work site, that would be much appreciated, though!
- Will I have fun?
 - Of course! Especially because you'll work alongside other teens from the area!
