Student and one parent must apply for an FSA ID. File the FAFSA when available (December 1) and no later than the individual college's deadline
CSS Profile	Some schools require the CSS Profile form in addition to the FAFSA. Complete the CSS Profile form beginning October 1 at: https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org/
