# Lesson Ideas

Lesson Title

EcoCrafters: Nature Inspired Art

Duration

1Hour

Lesson Plan

- 1. Introduction to Nature Art (10 minutes)
- Discuss the concept of nature-inspired art and its importance.
- Show examples of art made with natural materials, such as rock paintings or leaf collages.
- 2. Nature Walk and Material Collection (15 minutes)
- Lead the kids on a brief nature walk around the schoolyard or local park to collect simple natural materials like leaves, twigs, stones, and flowers.
- 3. Sorting and Prepping Materials (5 minutes)

- Return to the classroom and sort collected materials by type.
- Introduce recyclables like cardboard pieces, paper, and small containers for use in projects.
- 4. Creative Time: Making Nature Art (20 minutes)
- Provide guidance as kids create their nature-inspired art piece using both natural materials and recyclables.
- Encourage creativity, such as making leaf print patterns, twig sculptures, or rock animals.
- 5. Art Gallery Walk and Sharing (5 minutes)
- Arrange finished pieces and allow a gallery walk.
- Let kids present their artwork and share what inspired their creation.
- 6. Reflection and Clean-Up (5 minutes)
- Discuss what the kids learned about nature and recyclables through art.
- Guide kids in cleaning up their work area, reinforcing the importance of respecting nature.

# Materials List

- Collected natural items (leaves, twigs, stones, flowers)
- Recycled paper, cardboard, and small containers
- Scissors, glue, and non-toxic paint
- Brushes and water cups
- Markers and crayons

# Adaptations for Different Ages

- Younger Children: Focus on simpler art projects like leaf rubbings or collage-making.
- Older Children: Challenge them with more intricate designs or small sculptures using twigs and stones.

### **Movement Break**

- Nature Scavenger Hunt (5 minutes)
- A short burst of energy between activities: Kids find items that match a list of descriptions (e.g., "Find a round stone" or "Find a green leaf").

#### **Bonus Activities**

- Nature-inspired Storytime: Read a story or show a video about artists who use nature in their work.
- Create a Suncatcher: Use pressed flowers and leaves on contact paper to make suncatchers for classroom windows.
- Nature Journaling: Provide small notebooks for kids to sketch or describe their favorite nature finds.

# **Series Outline**

#### ### Week 1: Introduction to EcoCrafters

- Discuss the importance of eco-friendly crafting.
- Create a group "Eco Crafters" pledge to use sustainable practices.
- Go on a nature walk to collect simple materials like twigs, leaves, and stones.

## ### Week 2: Nature-Inspired Art

- Paint with natural materials like leaves and twigs.
- Create nature rubbings using crayons and textured objects found outside.
- Make mandalas using found objects arranged in patterns.

# ### Week 3: Crafting with Leaves and Flowers

- Press flowers and leaves to use in art projects.
- Create leaf crowns and flower bracelets.
- Design leaf prints on paper or fabric using paint.

### ### Week 4: Stone and Rock Creations

- Paint small stones to make garden markers or pet rocks.
- Assemble rock sculptures or cairns.
- Create story stones with painted images for storytelling games.

## ### Week 5: Twig and Branch Art

- Build small twig sculptures or mini-craft frames.
- Make natural mobiles by hanging twigs from a branch with twine.
- Craft mini-raft boats to float in water play areas.

### ### Week 6: Recyclable Creations

- Use cereal boxes and cartons to make 3D art pieces.
- Design bird feeders using plastic bottles or milk jugs.
- Construct musical instruments like shakers using cans and bottles.

## ### Week 7: Plant-Based Dyes and Textiles

- Dye fabric using plant-based pigments from items like beet juice or turmeric.
- Create tie-dye patterns with rubber bands and plant dyes.
- Weave small items with grass or plant stems.

# ### Week 8: Eco-Friendly Gift Making

- Craft eco-friendly wrapping paper using recycled paper and natural dyes.
- Design homemade seed paper cards and gifts.
- Create personalized bookmarks using recycled materials.

# ### Week 9: Upcycled Container Gardens

- Use old cans or containers as planters.
- Plant small herb gardens in recycled containers.
- Design and decorate plant markers made from popsicle sticks or old cutlery.

#### ### Week 10: EcoCrafters Showcase

- Organize an exhibition of all projects created during the course.
- Encourage kids to present one eco-friendly craft and explain its materials and process.
- Reflect on the importance of sustainable crafting and commit to future projects.
