Welcome and Updates

Assistant Superintendent Jim Monreal welcomed the Committee and introduced the Committee members once the meeting was called to order.

Minutes of October 19, 2023 Meeting

Jim Monreal shared the minutes from the January 18, 2024 meeting, there were no corrections.

SCCS District Update - Jim Monreal

Jim Monreal shared a video showcasing the District's efforts with reduced energy use and sustainability, including the installation of solar panels at several sites. Mr. Monreal explained that their partner Climatec has been working to make new construction in the District greener and more efficient.

Mission Hill Middle Update - Derek Kendall

Two Mission Hill teachers are the recipients of the Education Foundation's green award for their work with a float device tracking data in the ocean off of South America and investigating climate change with students. New energy efficient windows will be installed this summer.

Discussion ensued, with SCCS teacher Keresha Durham asking if there have been any efforts to curb single-occupancy cars dropping kids off at school each morning. Stu Branoff said at Bayview there have been efforts to incentivize kids to bike, walk or bus to school. Jim Monreal added that the District's new electric buses and van will make field trips more energy efficient as well.

Chris Soriano-Nature Club at SC Museum of Natural History

Students have removed half a ton of invasive species from natural spaces in Watsonville and Santa Cruz. They have also planted more than 350 plants across the county.

Janice Kelly-City of Santa Cruz Waste Reduction

The City of Santa Cruz Waste Management is hosting its annual poster contest for students to expressively share their ideas and understanding of waste reduction and recycling through artwork. All students will have the opportunity to have their art on our garbage trucks! This is also an opportunity for us to visit classrooms to talk about recycling and waste management; teachers can sign up for that on our website.

Mary Ann LoBalbo, Santa Cruz County

Mary Ann LoBalbo said the county has been working with schools on food waste, and have been weighing refuse after lunch times. They've also developed a corn-hole game with separate holes for recycling, organics, household waste and trash. The objective is to have kids collect items and determine how it should be disposed of. The county has also been campaigning for people to buy less.

Tiffany Wise-West:

Public meeting coming up on March 14 about new leaf blower rules – gas powered leaf blowers may be regulated in the City of Santa Cruz in the future. The city realizes this will be a challenge for some city partners, including the District's maintenance and facilities staff, and is trying to help access funding that would ease the transition.
