GRADING POLICY

We have been researching training opportunities for Standards based grading system training for teachers. We have received one quote for \$9200 for a three day training. Currently teachers in the elementary track standards through assignments and activities. Middle school teachers give A-F grades.

PLP (Parent/Teacher Conferences)

March 25th will be PLP day.

TUTORING

Tutoring takes place Monday through Thursday. The majority of students showing up are elementary students.

FACILITIES

We purchased air purifiers for each classroom/office with our first air quality award.

Swing fence - bus lane

HVAC in portable - money is available - need a plan for replacement/repair.

SALARY INCREASES

Increases were approved by the governor. Teacher base levels will increase from 40/50/60 to 50/60/70.

STAFFING

We currently have three positions open and posted: Middle school math (April 1, 2022), 5th grade (2022-2023 SY) and EA (2022-2023 SY)

SUMMER PROGRAMMING

Current planning will include an academic morning with STEM/STEAM activities.

COVID/ILLNESS UPDATE (February 8th most recent update)

All is quiet on the Covid front. We have had a few students with Strep (isolated to one class) but no reported Covid cases.

The new Toolkit updates are as follows:

An [updated COVID-19 Response Toolkit for New Mexico Public Schools](#) is released today. Updates from the previously published version on Jan.19 include:

- A requirement that children be up to date with COVID-19 vaccination to avoid quarantine or test to stay
- Changes in determining days to test for test to stay programs
- An extension on PCR staff surveillance testing (including VAULT) through Feb. 24
- Removal of the requirement to report all positive cases to the school community (close contacts must still be identified and notified)
- Removal of the requirement for infectious while on campus cases to be reported in the PED's Rapid Response Webform (so long as schools track their case percentages over the past 14 days and report appropriately in the DOH's provider portal)
- Allowing over-the-counter rapid antigen tests taken in the presence of a staff member for surveillance testing
- Removal of surveillance testing goal for students
