Course Description: Art 6, 7, 8 is a foundational class that focuses on the artistic capabilities of the whole child. In addition to learning various art skills such as drawing, color theory, values, shading, 3-D and conceptualizing, students will be encouraged to explore Intellectual Openness, Inquisitiveness, Analysis, Reasoning, Problem Solving, Precision, Proportion, Writing and Presentation throughout the course.

On rare occasions students may be asked to finish projects on their own time as needed. Incomplete, unfinished or rushed work will be graded according to the project ending rubric.

Artistic Process and Planning Assignments (Habits of Work): Artistic process assignments completed in your sketchbook will be monitored throughout the class for planning, process, and extra practice of skills. Sketchbooks will be turned in once a quarter for idea/skill development and completion. (50% Completion - 50% Development)
