Preparation prior to the lesson	<b>HATS</b> (Home Auslan Tasks) Sheet - teacher to print & cut, ready for end of each lesson.	
Learning Intention	<ul> <li>Learn how to tell a story in Auslan, using signs and CA (Constructed Action).</li> <li>Learn new signs related to the 'Red Riding Hood' story.</li> </ul>	
Success Criteria	<ul> <li>Recognise (see &amp; know) new signs related to 'Red Riding Hood " story.</li> <li>Use NMF (face and body) to represent the characters in the story.</li> <li>Correctly sign the new signs and use Constructed Action to retell the story.</li> </ul>	

Time	Teacher	Resources
5 mins	Set up the video to watch. Students seated on the floor.	
5 mins	Introduction: Introduce the topic - Fairy Tales	
	Come and join our Fairy Tale 'Red Riding Hood' as she takes food and visits Grandma. This Lesson is a little different to A Visit from Grandpa (in Term 1).	
	Learn the signs and how to use CA (Constructed Action) in storytelling. I hope Red Riding Hood will be alright, but I guess we already know the story. What happens at the end? (there can be a few versions)	
	Watch out for the wolf! Perhaps your class could re-enact the story too, with characters that sign.	
	<ul> <li>(Start of Lesson)</li> <li>Read and discuss the Learning Intention and Success Criteria.</li> <li>Check for understanding, clarifying vocabulary as necessary.</li> </ul>	
10 mins	Explicit Teaching: Watch the video	Lesson 31 video
	Use teacher discretion to decide if the class needs to watch any part of the video a second time.	
	Signs taught this lesson: Little Red Riding Hood, Wolf, Big ears have (CA), Big eyes have (CA) Big teeth have (CA) Revision - Grandma, food, delicious, biscuit	
5 mins	Explanation of Activity:	
	<ul> <li>Practise the signs and CA taught.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Be the Character:</li> <li>The aim of this activity is to use NMF (facial expression and body language) to be the character.</li> <li>The students separate into 3 groups</li> <li>The teacher allocates a character to each group - Wolf, Little Red Riding Hood or Grandma.</li> <li>Each group gets together to trial ways to represent the character - how they look - face - eyes and mouth, how they move - stand, walk, skip etc</li> <li>The teacher then rotates the groups, to have a different character to focus on. So the</li> </ul>	

	opportunity is there to represent each of the three characters.  The students return to the full group and share their characters.  Change the ending: The Class discusses possible change(s) to the ending of this story and decides on a good option. The best character portrayals are selected and used in the re-enactment. The class re-enacts the story (changing the ending) using sign, NMF, CA or whatever they choose. Setting the scene: How will the forest trees, Grandma's house, a path be represented - using students? The teacher or a student might narrate the story.
