| TEAM | Role | Description |
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| EXECUTIVE AND CREATIVE TEAM | Stage Manager Assistant Director | <p>Mads' 2IC! The Stage Manager A/D plays a pivotal role in ensuring the smooth operation of a community production from rehearsals to performances. They are responsible for coordinating all aspects of the production including backstage, serving as the primary liaison between the director, cast, crew, and production team. The A/D will be required to run a handful of rehearsals in the absence of the Director, and lead revisions floors whilst the Production team are running other sections.</p> <p>Key Responsibilities:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Rehearsal Management: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Support Directors with logistics b. Maintain order and efficiency during rehearsals, cueing actors and crew as needed 2. Documentation: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Support Directors to keep detailed records of rehearsal notes, blocking, and technical cues. b. Create and distribute run sheets and cue sheets to relevant team members as needed. 3. Communication: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Facilitate communication between the director, cast, crew, and production team members. b. Distribute important information such as rehearsal schedules, call times, and production updates. 4. Problem-solving: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Anticipate and address any issues that may arise during rehearsals or performances. b. Implement solutions to technical or logistical challenges quickly and |

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| | | <p>efficiently.</p> <p>5. Stage Management:</p> <p>a. Oversee assistant stage managers as needed</p> <p>b. Act as a liaison with backstage and creative teams, i.e. oversee the smooth execution of scene changes, ensuring that sets, props, and actors are in their correct positions.</p> <p>c. Seymour is a town of veterans and we would love to pay our respects to Seymour's military history by inviting a retired veteran to speak to our cast about their experiences in the Vietnam War as well as consulting with our Choreographer about accurate representation of military behaviours such as salutes and marches.</p> <p>Time Commitment 1 meeting with the choreographer and director, 1-3 x dedicated Rehearsal</p> |
