

Cell Phones and Electronic Devices

Instruction and student learning are top priorities at Olympic. When students are engaged, learning will occur. To do this, the classroom environment must be free of distractions. Please see the OHS Cell Phone Policy below:

- Limiting cell phone usage is in accordance with Rule 5 of the Code of Student Conduct
- Cell phones & headphones(wired and wireless) are to remain out of sight and silent during all classroom time; they should be turned off and stored
 - Students may check their phones during transition time and lunch
- Students may not use their cell phones, at any time, to make phone calls. For emergency calls, students should be given an e-hall pass to the main office to make or receive a call
- One earbud can be used before school in the waiting area and during lunch
- Bluetooth speakers are not allowed to be used on campus at any time. This includes lunches and transition times.
- Possession of a cell phone by a student during school hours is a privilege, which may be revoked for violations of the CMS Code of Student Conduct. Violations may result in confiscation and/or other disciplinary actions (see below).
- CMS is not responsible for theft, loss, or damage to cell phones or other PTDs brought onto CMS property. If students are permitted to use a cell phone during non-instructional times, they must follow all rules set forth in Policy S-SINT and Regulation S-SINT/R and sign the Student Internet Use Agreement.

1st Offense

Warning and parent contact. Contact is documented as a minor referral in Educator's Handbook.

2nd Offense

Referral to administration. All cell phones and electronic devices will be held by administration for a period of time determined by the administrator. Failure to surrender to the administrator will result in 1 day ISS.

3rd Offense

Referral to administration. All cell phones and electronic devices will be held by administration for a period of time determined by the administrator. Failure to surrender to the administrator will result in 2 days ISS.

4th Offense

Referral to administration. All cell phones and electronic devices will be held by administration for a period of time determined by the administrator. Students must surrender their phone and parent/guardian must pick up. Failure to surrender to the administrator will result in 2 days ISS.

5th Offense

Referral to administration. The student will become a 90 day rule violator, which means no participation/attendance for 90 days in extracurricular activities. Failure to surrender to the administrator will result in 1 day OSS.
