

Set Gmail as Default Mail App in Windows 10

Open Google Chrome

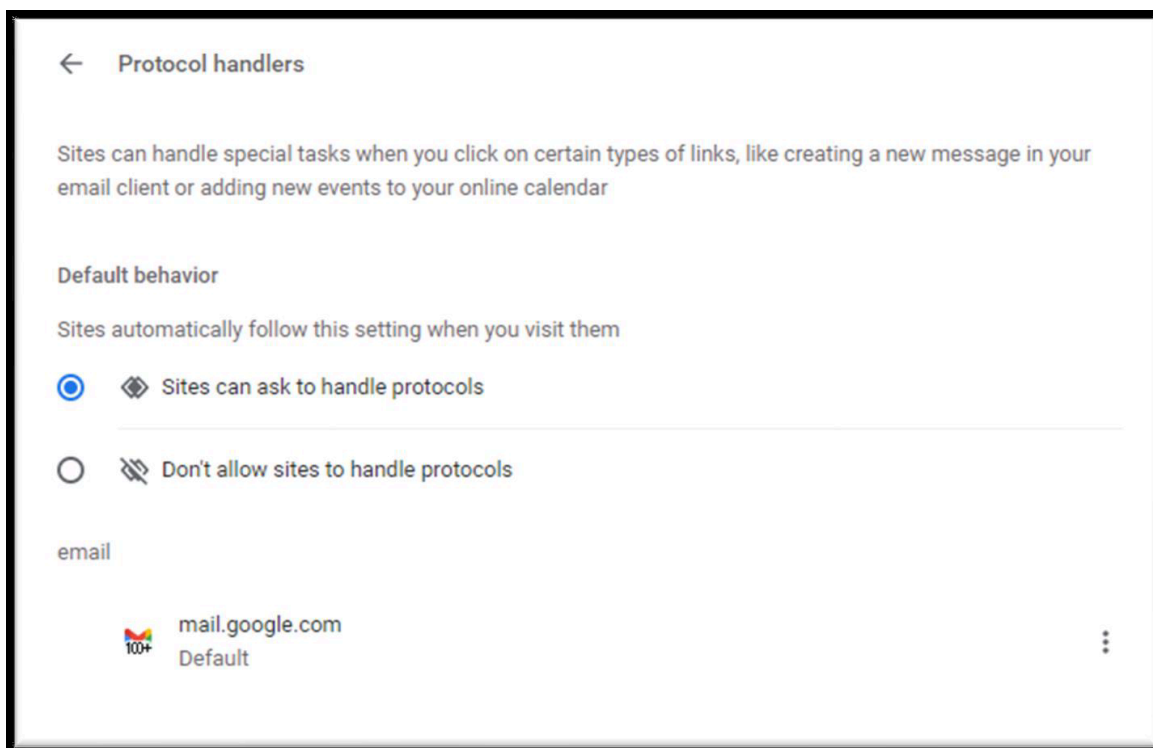


Log into your TSC email (www.tsc.k12.in.us – quicklinks – gmail)

In the far right click on the 3 dots next to your pic or initials

- Click on Settings
- Click on Privacy and Security in left margin menu
- Site Settings – click on arrow on far right
- Expand the Additional permissions below 'Background sync' (It may already show the options under it without expanding)
- Protocol handlers – click on arrow on far right

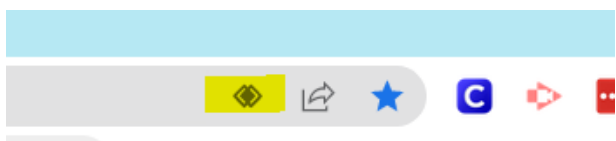
Verify it shows the following:



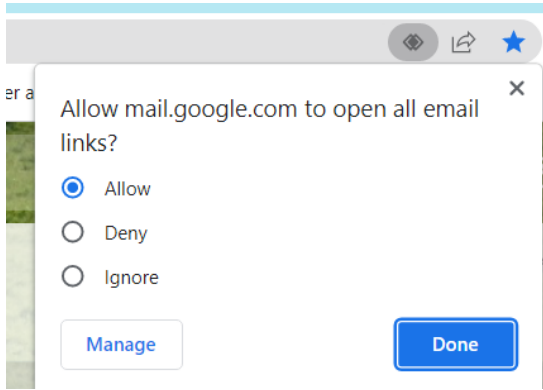
If mail.google.com is not your default for email and it is something else – click the 3 dots on right and then click on remove for the program that is listed.

Close all Chrome tabs.

Open Chrome and open Gmail. Look for the double diamonds in the URL line.



Click the Double Diamond to find an action menu. Select Allow and Done.

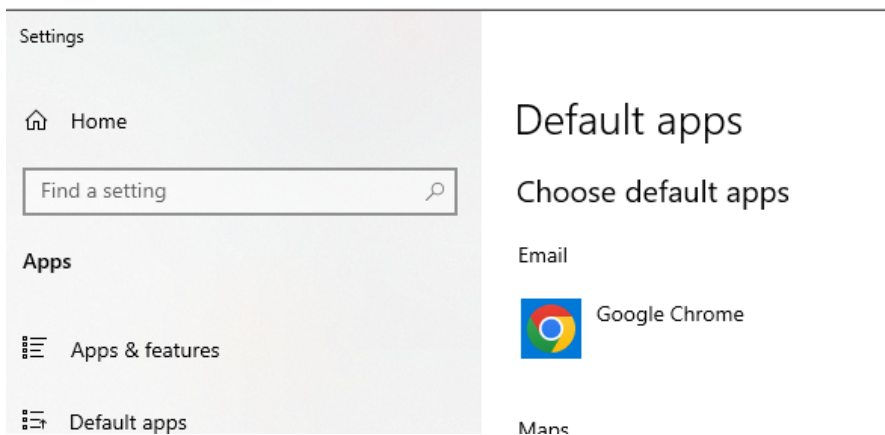


The following should be set by policy, but in case you are still having issues, be sure to check the following settings.

Setting your Default mail app

Click the Windows icon in the lower left corner, just start typing Default apps and it should find that for you. Select Default Apps.

Confirm that the Email App has now been changed from Mail to Google Chrome:



Close the window with the X in the upper right corner.

TSC gmail should now be your default email program
