# **Principal's Report**

- It's almost the end of the 2nd trimester
- The Cultural Heritage Festival was well attended and everyone had a great time
- March 19, there is a WCEF fundraiser Taste and Toast (more info in WCEF Updates below)
- The Measure J committee met and saw some of the plans the architects had been putting together. It still needs to go to the district board for their approval. Measure J will include an inside and outside "refresh." The project starts next summer, 2026, and will finish in the summer of 2027.

## **Teacher's Report**

Thank you for the monthly budget updates; they're very helpful.

## **Treasurer Update**

- Our semi-annual audit was done, and we passed.
- Monthly updates on teacher and room parent funds are sent to Melissa at the end of every month.
- Several line items, such as the library fund, 5th-grade scholarships, the art teacher fund, and the art and music night, have not been spent yet. In a future meeting, we may discuss how or if we want to allocate these funds elsewhere.
- The board voted to allocate the Parcel & Tax Campaign budget to the Measure T fund.
- The board voted to allocate extra funds from the general hospitality budget to Michael Corritone's hospitality budget to cover the \$193.31 overage spent on a staff development day.

#### **Site Council**

- We have two more meetings this year, one in March and one in May.
- At the last meeting, we went through all the goals for the year and gave updates on the auction items.
- The next meeting is to assess our progress on these action items and our year-end goals.
- They will start making a draft for next year's goals at the next two meetings.

#### **IDEA Committee**

 Huge thank you to everyone who made the day so exciting and fun. It was great to see so many people turn out and share themselves with others - especially given the divisive political climate. There's a feedback survey in the Hawk Happenings, so please share your ideas to make next year even better!

### **Staff Apprecation**

- They restocked the staff lounge in January and bought a new coffee maker.
- In February, they had a Valentine's event for the teachers.
- In Mar ch, they are planning an appreciation event for St. Patrick's Day.
- April will be a "stock the lounge" and "welcome back" event from spring break.
- May has staff appreciation week, so there will be an event every day of that week.
- The lead of staff appreciation will not be returning to her role but is documenting a "playbook," so it's an easy handoff for the next person who wants to take on the lead role.

## **WCEF Updates**

- Fundraising Update: To date we have raised \$1,169,495 (73% of \$1.6 goal). This is \$47,890 less than we had raised this time last year. We are not on track to raise \$1.6 million. The next few months will be crucial for us as we begin budget discussions for the '25-26 school year. Donating to WCEF is the only way to preserve additional classes, salaries, and wellness services.
  - IV is at 50% of families participating, while this time last year we were at 54%.
     For the Turn up the Heat our school raised the lowest amount out of all schools at \$11,889.
