Project Idea Summary of the issue, challenge, investigation, scenario, or problem:

Students will be assigned into groups. Students will gather factual information about Native American Tribes. Students must form a presentation using factual material about Native American Tribes values, traditions, and culture. Student's will design their own tribe name and present their tribe to the class. Student's presentations may be presented by skit or Google slides. Each group must make a visual aid for the presentation. (Examples of visual aids may include the following: teepees, totem poles, Indian jewelry, & Indian head dress)

Day One:
