Course Description: In this course, students will continue to develop listening and speaking skills, then read and write what they can say—familiar words, commands, phrases, short and complex sentences, and intermediate questions. They will learn to use predictable language in familiar settings. They will continue to develop cultural awareness and the ability to recognize the products, practices, and perspectives of the culture. They will also use the language to expand their knowledge in all content areas.

Students will build on what they learned in both French 1 and 2. There is a focus on grammar in this course as students will learn the imperfect tense (l'imparfait), the conditional mood (le conditionnel), two future tenses (le futur simple et le futur antérieur), and how to give advice (les conseils) while continuing to use the composed past (le passé composé) and the present indicative tense. Our units of study are "My Childhood", "Travel", "My Future" and "Health". By the end of the course, students will be able to describe what they were like as a child and what they enjoyed doing, discuss where they would like to travel (with a focus on French and Francophone countries/regions), plan their future, identify and describe healthy practices, and compare and contrast practices from different Francophone cultures.

- <u>Instructional Strategies</u>: Students will learn through various strategies such as TPR (total physical response), visual aids, listening and speaking activities, role-playing, writing, and reading comprehension.

- In my own and other cultures I can make comparisons between products and practices to help me understand perspectives.
 - End of Year Target: Intermediate
