Background: This article should be written in MS Word using A4 paper with margins of 3 cm top, 3 cm bottom, 4 cm left, and 3 cm right. The full article's maximum pages are 15 with 1.5 line spacing font Times New Roman 10 pt. The title article must be effective and not use question sentences. The place and time of research are not included in the title article except there is a specific place and time of the research.

Method: No more than **250** words in abstract. **Result:** The abstract should be informative and include background, goals/aims of research, methods, results and discussion and conclusion. Do not use Non-Standard Acronym. **Conclusion :** Abstract should be informative , and not only explain P value to show the difference t but also mention value of correlation or differences.

1. INTRODUCTION [Georgia 11 bold]

The introduction includes the background to the issue or problem as well as the urgency and rationalization of activities (community service). Activity objectives and problem-solving plans are presented in this section. A review of relevant literature is included in this section. The introduction of a research report essentially outlines concisely the justification for why the research needs to be conducted. The introduction should include the reason for conducting the research, the formulation of the problem, the rationale for the problem, the hypothesis, and the research objectives. The main problem of conducting research is stated with reference to the latest

developments in thinking (literature referenced in the last 5-10 years as a comparison of the researcher's thinking). The introduction should not be confused with the literature review, so there should not be too many references in the introduction. References should be critical and the literature review does not need to be complete and exhaustive (no more literature review headings). Briefly, the content of the introduction includes the background of the research (justification of why the research needs to be done): what is already known, what needs to be added, where is the understanding to date, the existing problems and contains hypotheses or research objectives and the agenda to be

carried out. The introduction contains 3 to 5 paragraphs and no more than 1 page.

3. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

This section presents the results of community service. Results can be supplemented with tables, graphs (images), and/or charts. The discussion section describes the results of the activity.
