

Distance Learning Plan For Families and Students

Below is important information for Distance Learning at Spero Academy. Please take the time to read the content.

Distance Learning will begin on Monday, April 6th. Distance Learning at Spero Academy will take place until at least April 30. Please note that this timeline may be changed in the future due to additional guidance from the Minnesota Department of Education.

Overview of the Distance Learning Plan:

Over the course of this Distance Learning Plan Spero Academy staff will partner with families to assist students in engaging in this new mode of learning. Classroom teachers will be instrumental in continuing to communicate and provide instruction to their students. Families/Guardians will have options and resources that will give them choices in distance learning that best fit their students' learning style. The Distance Learning Plan will be assessed weekly based on feedback from families and Spero Academy staff.

Learning Platforms

Spero Academy will use a blended model of digital and analog tools to deliver instruction and track student learning.

The following *Online Platforms* will be used for planning and delivering remotely:

• Seesaw, Google Classroom, Zoom, individual classroom Youtube channels.

The following Analog Tools will be used for planning, and delivering remotely:

Hard copy resources in the form of work packets will be provided to students weekly.
 Examples of hard copies are textbooks or leveled readers, worksheets, social stories, visuals and visual schedules.

Communication

- Communication platforms: *Seesaw, Google Classroom, Zoom,* individual classroom *Youtube* Channels, *Google Voice,* Spero Academy email and phone calls
- Daily interactions will happen each day from the classroom teacher and/or classroom support staff (ex. Paraprofessionals, Teacher Assistants) through a variety of platforms and based on teacher and family decisions.

Student Learning Day

What does a Distance Learning Day look like for Spero Academy students?

We want families to create a schedule for their students based on what is best for their family.

Each day daily interaction will happen with your classroom teacher or classroom team member. You and your teacher will decide what time of day check in works best for you. Your teacher will supply you with a Flex Learning Plan specific to the student's learning style through digital, analog or a blend of both formats. Your family will decide when to complete the activities and assignments throughout the day or evening. Hours of learning will vary depending on grade level, Special Education services, and English Language Learner services. Here is an example of a Flex Learning Plan.

If you have specific questions about activities or assignments, contact your student's classroom teacher.

Amount of Time Learning

Spero Academy's Distance Learning experience will begin on April 6, 2020.

- During the first week of distance learning we will be focusing on review, practice, learning how to navigate remote learning and troubleshooting any issues with distance learning.
- Starting April 13th we foresee the hours per day of distance learning will look something like the following. These times are general guidelines and Special Education services and/or English Language Learner services will also determine the amount of hours students are working.
 - Grades K-2: 1 2 hours

Grades 3-6: 2 - 3 hours

The above hours are guidelines. Please work with your classroom teacher if your family is needing more flexible options.

Delivery Schedule of Paper Packets

- During distance learning Flex Learning packets will be delivered to students' homes. The first
 delivery will be on April 2nd and will contain two weeks worth of instruction. The anticipated
 delivery dates of packets are as follows and will be split between two days in the following
 weeks. Completed packets will be picked up on the same delivery dates. These dates could
 be subject to change as we go forward with the distance learning plan.
 - Thursday, May 21, 2020
 - o Thursday, June 4, 2020
 - o Thursday, June 18, 2020

- All Flex Learning Lesson Plans for individual students will be emailed or posted by your classroom teacher on an online platform Monday morning of each week by 8:30 am in order for families to access links to digital instruction.

Student Expectations

- Students will know where to find distance learning assignments
- Students will connect with teachers via email, Seesaw, Zoom, Google Classroom, Google Voice to ask questions or get feedback on assignments
- Students will complete their assignments as directed to the best of their ability

Parent Expectations

Spero Academy understands the challenges facing families as we begin to implement a distance learning plan with your students. Spero Academy is here to support families and students as we navigate this plan.

We are asking you as parents/guardians for the following support:

- Read email updates sent from Spero Academy
- Familiarize yourselves with your teacher's mode of communication or delivery of instruction (ex. *Seesaw, Zoom, Google Classroom, Google Voice*)
- Families without home Internet access or with limited Internet access please inform your teacher of this fact so needed modifications to assignments and due dates can be made.
- Read Flex Learning plans sent to you by your teachers
- Support your student in their at-home learning to the best of your ability
- Email your teachers with any questions and concerns regarding the Flex Learning Plans (For example; needing more time to complete assignments, difficulty accessing content)
- Families of students with an Individualized Education Plan will follow lessons provided by their special education teachers

Attendance

Attendance will be taken by your child's teacher on or before 12:00 pm each day. Your teacher will let you know on which platform they intend to take attendance. (ex. *Seesaw*, email, phone call, *Google Classroom*) Please let your student's teacher know if your student is ill and cannot participate on a particular day. If your teacher is unable to reach you on a given day, it will be marked as an unexcused absence. Students whose families choose to opt out of distance learning will be marked as an unexcused absence. If families are needing alternatives or accommodations for attendance-taking please contact your student's classroom teacher to make arrangements.

Technology Access

Technology is available for Spero Academy students who do not have the technology they need to access their curriculum at home. Please send a technology request to Erin Giebink (egiebink@spero.academy) if you need a device for your student. The type of device most appropriate for your student is determined by their classroom teacher.

Special Education

- If your student has an Individualized Education Program (IEP), in addition to general
 education distance learning, your student will have an individualized distance learning plan
 (IDLP) for their special education services during this time. Your student is entitled to equal
 access to learning and materials including technology during this time as well.
- Due to the nature of distance learning taking place from the home, other individuals may have access to the distance learning classroom when supporting their student's participation.
 We will work to ensure that your child's educational record remains private. Similar to when you visit your child's classroom in person, we ask that you maintain student confidentiality during distance learning.
- IEP Team meetings will be held online via platforms via conference call or video platforms such as Zoom. Your case manager will work with you on setting up the meeting and will send you a link to join the meeting.
- Evaluations will continue, the IEP team will work with you on development of an evaluation plan and determine which testing can be completed remotely or if we need to wait to finish the evaluation when face to face school resumes.
- Mental Health services will continue to be provided via conference call or video services by our school psychologist. Please email your case manager if you are in need of mental health support.

English Learners Programming

During distance learning EL instruction will be provided to previously identified ELL students based on the student's learning style and parent input through digital, analog or a blend of both formats. The EL instructor will provide materials to ELL students that support the students in developing their English skills in reading, writing, speaking and listening. Paper materials will be made available in the student's classroom packets sent home on the designated delivery dates. (Refer to the Delivery Schedule of Paper Packets bookmark on this document.) As with the student's regular classroom work, your family will decide when to complete the activities throughout the day or evening. The EL instructor will check in with students one time weekly through email, *Seesaw*, or *Zoom* meetings based on family preference. Classroom teachers have guidance to use multilingual resources such as *Google Translate*, *Google Voice*, or Spero Academy staff to communicate with families.
