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The islands and where they are on our lists - teacher Jora

Well, once again, hello! This is another series in learning or a video for you to watch and learn about the Eastern and Western islands. And like I said before, this is very important for a student or a Marshallese child to know these things. And the best way to learn like we said before, please take notes or write in your notebook. And really study every day so that you will understand and know. And these things should be firmly grounded within you as a Marshallese person. And in the islands, in the East and the West. Now we will move down to look at the islands that are in the East. In the islands in the East, here are there islands: Aelok, Ānenkio, Arņo, Aur, Ārkup, Bokaak, Jemō, Likiep, Mājeej, Mājro, Mile Maļoelap, Naḍikdik, Pikar, Tōke, Utrōk and Wōjjā. Well, those are the 17 islands from the East. And now since we have looked at the islands from the East, let's go and see the islands from the West. And we will go ahead and check out these Islands to the West now. These are the islands in the West: Aelōñlaplap, Āelōñinnae, Ānewetak, Ellep or some say Lep, Epoon, Jālwōj, Jebat, Kōle, Kuwajleen, Lae, Naḿdik, Naḿo, Pikinni, Roñdik, Roñlap, Ujae Wōtto and Wūjlañ. Well, these are the islands from the West, there are 18

in total. Now let's look at this list of islands, in the Marshall Islands. There are some lists that they call districts or they list them as provisions, and in the East, like I said, you will see these islands on this list. And in the East there are two divisions, the first is the Ratak Rak (East South) and the second one is the Ratak Eañ (East North). And these are not just islands in the East and West, but these are fragments that they have separated and divided the atolls or islets, which are the Ratak Rak (East South) and Ratak Eañ (East North). And these things, South and North are over to the eastern side of the south and over on the western side of the north in these islands. Now we will move down to see the islands that are on the Ratak Rak (East South). What islands are in the East South? That is a really good question right there. First of all, they are as follows: Ñadikdik, Mile and Arño. There are only three islands in the East South. Now let's see, what islands are in the East North? This is also a good question. Now the islands that are in the East North are these islands: Aelok, Aur, Ādkup, Ānenkio, Jemo, Maļoelap, Mājeej, Likiep Pikar, Tōke and Wōjjā. Well, those are the islands that are in the East North. Now we have completed our look at the East North and the South. So now let's hoist up and move down to look at the islands that are in the West South and the West North. So which islands are in the West South? First of all, are the islands of Epoon, Naṃdik, Jālwoj, Kōle, Jebat, and half of Wōja; Aelōñlaplap, to the south. Right? Well these are the islands that are located in the West South. So now let's look at the islands that are in the West North. Which islands are in the West North? Well, attached therein are the following: half of Wōja Aelōñlaplap to the north, Naṃo, Ellep or some say Lep, Kuwajleen, Ujae, Lae, Wōtto, Roñdik, Roñlap, Pikinni, Aelōñinae, Ānewetak and Wūjlañ. Well, this is all the information regarding the Islands in the East and West, as well as the Eastern North, Eastern South, Western North and Western South. And there are still some more, we will make some more videos for you to learn more about these scattered divisions or

locations in and the islands therein. From these short and scattered words, sending you all luck as you learn and please, really study and look into these from time to time.
