His brothers are scattered throughout the world, Sgt. Harold Marsh with the First army in Germany, John Marsh, a chief warrant gunner on the cruiser San Francisco in the Pacific, Lt. (JG) Gerald Marsh with the destroyer Albert W. Grant at Norfolk, Va., AMM1/C Forrest Marsh, an instructor at Jacksonville, Fla., and TM3/C Raymond Marsh, on a PT boat in the Philippine area.
