Today and tomorrow students are beginning a project in social studies class. This is a Netflix themed project and the students have had so much fun working on this in the past! This project is worth 55 points and will be the first major assessment of the second trimester.

I will speak to the students about the importance of choosing a partner or group that will help them be most successful. I will remind students that they can work with their friends during class time, but still submit separate assignments so that they have more autonomy over the final project. Please also discuss this with your child at home. While A day students did start the project today, it is not too late for them to choose to work independently if that is what you as a family decide is best.

The project is a Netflix project where the students will create a fictional tv series about the causes of the American Revolution. They will be creating a show title, series summary, series trailer, eight episode titles and summaries, and some more creative details. As I track the student's progress, I will set a final due date. This week in social studies students worked on their Columbus trial project.

Presentations for the Columbus trial are 10/4 (A day) and 10/7 (B day).

The project requires that students work in groups and act as attorneys who will present in front of the jury. The trial is for the death of the Tainos, a group of Native Americans that faced enslavement, death and cultural demise after the arrival of Europeans. Students worked to gather evidence to defend their clients and evidence to assign blame to another group. Students are learning to:

- work with primary and secondary sources
- write thesis statements
- use evidence to support their claim
- complete research
- work collaboratively
- be persuasive
- speak publicly

The students have worked really hard on this assignment over the last few class blocks and I cannot wait to hear their final presentations!

In social studies this week we worked on writing thesis statements. Students took their original thesis statements from the benchmark assignment and gave them a "glow up".

Additionally, we introduced a new project about Christopher Columbus and the Tainos. The Tainos are the people native to the Caribbean at the time of Columbus' arrival. Students will work in groups and pretend to be lawyers in the trial of the death of the Tainos. We will continue working on this project all of next week. The project will be due the week of 9/30, but the exact due date has not been determined yet. Next week we will switch gears for a little bit and learn about the Holocaust and the conditions that led to WWII. I am going to be providing students with the historical context necessary for them to understand their work with Holocaust related texts in LA.

Last week in social studies we reviewed how to analyze a primary source document and previewed some of the documents for our upcoming DBQ. DBQ assignments require students to analyze several primary sources on the same topic and then respond to a writing prompt. We will continue working on the documents this week and will begin our essay later in the week.

High school recommendation forms will be coming home soon and I would like to explain next year's social studies course offerings before you receive the recommendations. US 1 Honors is not an offered course. Instead, incoming freshman can be recommended for AP US1 and AP US 2. AP US history is a 10 credit course for students in grade 10. The course covers the US1 and US2 requirements. Students who take AP US history will take a history elective freshman year.

By recommending a student for AP history, it would alter the course of their history requirements for their high school career. As a result, I only recommended students for AP if I felt extremely confident that they could transition successfully into an AP course by sophomore year. There may be students with an A average who did not get recommended for AP. Having an A average in an 8th grade level class does not mean they will be successful in a college level course by sophomore year. I want students to be at the level they will find the most success and happiness. Transitioning to high school is a major adjustment and I want to ensure students do not experience additional stress by taking a course that may be too advanced for them. With that said... the decision is ultimately up to you and your family. If you or your child feels they would be most successful in the US 1 & Us 2 AP course, then I recommend you reach out to the high school social studies supervisor to further discuss. Please let me know if you have any questions

December 15, 2023

Students have been continuing to work on their Netflix projects which are due 12/20 (a day) and 12/21 (b day). This project is worth 55 points and is one of the biggest assignments of the trimester. They will have one more class block to work on the assignment, but please remind your children to work on these at home if they are not on track to be finished by the due date. This week the students presented their Columbus trial projects and overall, they did a fantastic job! Public speaking is a hard skill to master, but most students enthusiastically shared their group's work using websites, google slides, visual aids and skits that they created. Students had their first homework assignment this week and that will also be entered into genesis by the end of the day. I do not give homework frequently, but when I do, it is important that students make an effort to complete it in a timely manner. Missing even just one homework assignment can have a negative impact on a student's overall average. I will accept this assignment late, but students will lose points for every day that it is late.

After our Columbus trial presentations, we began DBQ "glow ups". During our glow ups, students worked on improving key points of their DBQ benchmark essay from the start of the school year. We started by revising our hook/lead and next week we will continue the glow up by revising our thesis statements.

Yesterday and today we started reviewing the background information and directions for our upcoming project. Students will be working in assigned groups, but they will receive individual grades. In order to monitor group contributions, every class we will track what each student was in charge of for the day and the progress that they made. The project requires students to pretend to be the attorneys for one of the groups being blamed for the death of the Tainos people. The group will create a written defense statement, a presentation of their innocence and a statement of blame where they pick another group to hold responsible for the crime. This project will officially begin next week and continue into the week after.

Last week we covered some of the highlights of the presidencies of Jefferson and Madison including the Louisiana Purchase and the War of 1812. Now that the students are familiar with the leadership style of some of the early presidents of the US, we will comparing and contrasting them. Ultimately, students will be designing their own ideal leader by creating a project that shows what qualities they think a good leader should posses, how leadership can be shown on a large scale and on a small scale, and explaining why leadership is important in a democratic society. The final project for this assignment can be presented in any format besides an essay or a PowerPoint. Examples of leadership projects in the past include songs, advertisements, commercials, videos, plays, board games, card games, children's books and websites. As long as the students meet the criteria in their checklist and follow the goals on the rubric, they can be as creative as possible with this. This project will continue through this week and next week during testing and should be completed mostly in school.

Last week in social studies class, students used their knowledge of the Bill of Rights to create a fictional playlist. Each of the ten songs in the playlist corresponded to the first ten amendments. Students created a fictional song title, artist name and album name. Additionally, students used images to create album art for the assignment. The students did a wonderful job and were really creative with their songs.

This week we are working on a DBQ (document based questions). On day 1, DBQs ask students to analyze primary source documents on a specific topic and respond to questions about the documents. On day 2, students will use the information from the documents to respond to an essay prompt. Students must use the information from the documents as evidence for their claims in the essay. The essay prompt is, "How does the Constitution guard against tyranny?".

Next week on 3/28 (a day) and 3/29 (b day), students will have a quiz on the Bill of Rights. There is a study guide available for them on google classroom.

March 9

This week students have been examining the Bill of Rights and then applying their knowledge to analyze landmark court cases. Students were very engaged in this activity and did a great job discussing and debating.

In the next few weeks, students will be reading about the Holocaust in Language Arts class. My goal is to provide them with the background information necessary to understand the historical context of the material they will be reading in LA. The main question we will be focusing on is, "What political, social and economic conditions led to the Holocaust?". Please let me know if you have any questions.

January 17

This week in social studies we will be discussing the Constitutional Convention. Students will be exploring the decisions that our founding fathers had to make while trying to create the Constitution. We will be looking at the perspective of Federalists and Anti-Federalists and discussing the beliefs of both sides. After that, students will write a paragraph about the ratification of the Constitution from each perspective. Next, students will choose one side and create an advertisement for or against ratification. This assignment is due 1/23 for b day students and 1/24 for a day students. January 3

I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday and happy New Year! In social studies this week we are learning about the Declaration of Independence. Students will be writing a break

up letter from the colonists to King George III and outlining the reasons why the relationship between the two is no longer working. This assignment is due 1/9 for a day students and 1/20 for b day students. Please let me know if you have any questions.

December 16

This week we completed presentations of the Netflix projects and they were awesome! Additionally, we have been listening to some songs from the musical Hamilton that relate to our curriculum. Students have to respond to prompts about these songs and that assignment is due 12/22 (a day) and 12/23 (b day). This work has been completed in class, but if a student was absent for part of the assignment or needs help, they have until the end of next week. Starting next week we will begin working on the topics of the Declaration of Independence and the battles of the American Revolution. Please let me know if you have any questions.

November 28

Later this week students will be starting a group project where they create their own Netflix series about the causes of the American Revolution. While students will not actually film the episodes, they will create a show title and summary, episode titles and summaries, use images, critic reviews, etc. to describe the events we have discussed in class. I am really looking forward to this project and seeing how creative our students can be.

Choosing groups- The students will be allowed to choose if they would like to work independently or in groups of two or three. If the students choose to work in a group, they will get to pick their partners. As always I will discuss with students the importance of choosing partners who have a similar work either as them and someone they think they will be successful working with. If as a family you feel that your child might do better working independently, please discuss that with them this evening before we start choosing partners.

November 21

Tuesday and Wednesday students will be receiving a study guide to help them prepare for an upcoming social studies quiz. The quiz will be 11/30 (a day) and 12/1 (b day). The quiz is 20 multiple choice questions about the causes of the American Revolution. In addition to the study guide, we have been and will continue to play review games to help the students prepare. Please let me know if you have any questions.
