## ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY~

# **Athletic Code/ General Rules:**

- 1. Academic or disciplinary obligations take precedence over all other school activities.
- 2. As a team member you represent your school and RSU5. Please respect both!
- 3. Athletes must attend all practices on time unless meeting academic or disciplinary obligations.
- 4. School attendance: Athletes will be subject to all provisions of the school attendance policy. Additional school attendance regulations may be imposed by the coach.
- 5. All athletes are required to travel to and from out of town contests with the team. An athlete may be released directly to a parent (in some cases) if prior arrangements have been made with the coach.
- 6. Students must have passing grades in all classes to play in games. Students need to be at all games and practices to be part of the team. If a student needs to miss a team event, they need to contact the coach in advance to let them or it will be considered an unexcused absence. If there are two or more unexcused absences the student may be dismissed from the team. Students who miss practice for excused or unexcused reasons may see reduced playing time in the next event.

# **Athletic Eligibility Policy:**

Co-curricular activities are an integral part of school life. The knowledge and skills learned through these activities are critically important to the healthy development of students (MPA – Sports Done Right, 2005). At Freeport Middle School academic work is our first priority. While there are many benefits to participating in co-curricular activities, the time commitment involved can sometimes detract from

academic work. In an effort to help students balance the demands of academics and participation in interscholastic competitions we have developed the following eligibility procedure:

Student Athletes must have habits of work (preparedness) above 2.5 or if they do not the content grade needs to be 3.0 or higher to participate in games. All classes include core academic classes, unified arts, band and chorus. Any student athlete who does not have a 2.5 or higher on either the habits of work (preparedness) unless their content grade is above a 3. Academic probation dictates that a student may not participate in game situations/interscholastic competitions with their respective team until he/she has successfully raised their grade(s) to be eligible. The student is expected to practice if they are not staying after school to make up work. If a student has been ineligible for 3 weeks they can be dismissed from the team.

#### **Timeline and Process**

- 1. Advisors will regularly support students in checking their grades and support students in developing responsible habits for their school performance (i.e. following up with teachers following an absence, recognizing incomplete work and attending office hours, etc.)
- 2. The Assistant Principal will check Powerschool for content and habits of work grades for sixth, seventh and eighth grade athletes every 2nd week of each athletic season.
- 3. If a student has a current Preparedness grade of less or equal to than a 2.5 and a content grade below a 3.0 during the check, the Assistant Principal will initiate an Eligibility Probation for the student. The student would begin their probationary period on Step 1. The steps of Eligibility Probation are described below:

Students will be provided a notice and action plan template to complete with the teachers with whom their Preparedness grades are below a 2.5 and content below a 3. It will be the student's responsibility to bring a copy of the plan home and explain to their parents the action steps they are responsible for taking.

After one week, the Assistant Principal will check in with the teachers regarding the student's participation in their plan. If the student has taken all steps necessary, has brought their Preparedness grade up to a 2.5 or content grade up to a 3, and the teacher signs off, then the student will no longer be on probation. If they have taken the steps necessary, but have not yet brought their grade up, they remain on "Step 1". If they have taken no steps indicated on their action plan, they drop to "Step 2" as outlined above.
