July 16th - An Introduction To Mindfulness And How It Can Decrease Our Suffering

Leader: Dr. Renee Hoekstra obtained a Masters Degree at Seattle University in Existential-Phenomenological psychology her Doctorate of Psychology from Pacific University. She completed a postdoctoral position at Massachusetts Mental Health Center in Dialectical Behavior Therapy and obtained her license in 2008. She has had various coursework in mindfulness interventions for depression and mental health and has been teaching short mindfulness practices in small group settings for the last 20 years. She has become creative, skillful, and discerning in helping people regulate attention, find self-compassion, show up for the moment, manage difficult emotions, sit quietly, observe their breath, acknowledge reality, find inner peace, and act with inner wisdom. She has had training in Dialectical Behavior Therapy, Acceptance and Commitment Therapy, Compassion Focused Therapy, Mindfulness Based Stress Reduction, and Functional Analytic Therapy- all treatment interventions that rely on teaching and modeling mindful awareness.
