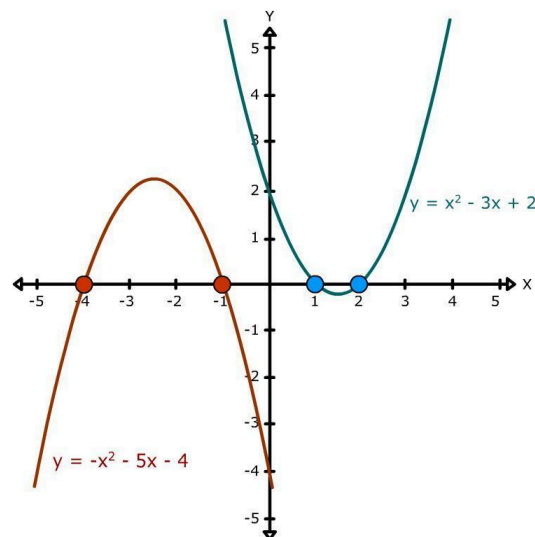

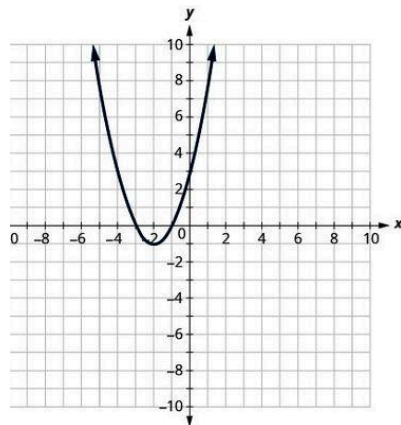

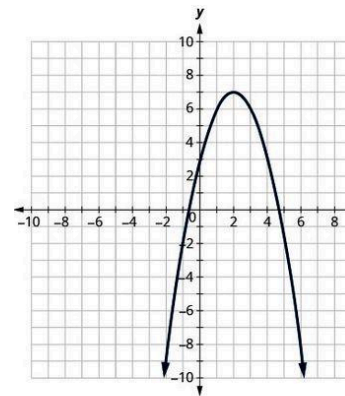
Gambar 1. Experimental and theoretical I-V Characteristic for RTC solar cell at 33 °C
