1-point LINEAR PERSPECTIVE (Formative)

"It is well to remember that a picture- before a battle horse, a nude woman or some anecdote- is essentially a plane surface covered with colors [and lines] assembled in a certain order." – Maurice Denis

1-POIN	IT LINEAR PERSPECTIVE
	Gather your ruler, pencil, paper and eraser and then draw a horizontal straight line across your paper (it doesn't have to be directly in the center)- this is your <b>HORIZON LINE</b> .
	Make a little dot somewhere near the center of your horizon line- this is your VANISHING POINT (VP).
	Decide what shapes you'd like to create. For example, with a square, you need to draw all four edges (with a ruler), so that their sides are straight horizontals and verticals.
	In order to make your shape 3-D you have to connect the edges with the VP and then draw in those lines (making the sides, bottoms, tops of your shape), giving it depth.
	To make the back end of the form, you need to draw straight horizontal and vertical lines that are parallel to the original shape's edges you first drew (the front of the shape).
	Erase all the unnecessary lines.
	Experiment and make at <u>least ten different forms</u> (5 above and 5 below the horizon line) <u>USING CORRECT LINEAR</u> <u>PERSPECTIVE (WITH A RULER)</u>
