AIUSA's initial core campaign ask is Temporary Protective Status (TPS) for Guatemala and reinstating TPS for El Salvador and Honduras for people already in the country (also part of the Last 100 Days work).

Abstract: Following the presentation in March 2016 of a summary containing the salient issues of concern involving Argentina documented by Amnesty International, the organization wishes to share with the Committee on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women of the United Nations (the CEDAW Committee) this updated report, prior to the seventh periodic review on Argentina. In this report Amnesty International addresses concerns involving sexual and reproductive health and violence against women.

Title: Australia: Island of Despair: Australia's "processing" of refugees on Nauru

Abstract: The current policy of the Australian Government is that no person who arrives in the country by boat seeking asylum can ever settle in Australia. Instead, anyone who arrives by boat is forcibly taken to offshore "Refugee Processing Centres", one of which is on the remote Pacific island of Nauru. The government claims that the policy protects people who might otherwise undertake the hazardous boat crossing to Australia. However, since its inception, offshore processing has been designed to be punitive and has been widely promoted by a succession of Australian governments as a deterrent and as a demonstration of Australia securing its borders.

Abstract: Amnesty International submits this document in advance of the Committee against Torture's consideration of Finland's seventh periodic report on the implementation of the Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment (hereinafter the Convention) in November 2016. The present submission summarizes Amnesty International's concerns regarding Finland's failure to comply with its obligations under the Convention.

Abstract: The armed conflict in Iraq has had a devastating impact on civilians. The armed group calling itself the Islamic State (IS) has committed crimes under international law including war crimes and crimes against humanity in territories under its control and launched deadly bombings and other attacks elsewhere in Iraq. The plight of internally displaced persons (IDPs) does not end once they reach territories outside of IS control. Hundreds of thousands continue to live in dire conditions with insufficient or no access to essential services and medical care.

Abstract: Encryption helps protect people's human rights online. By rendering digital data unintelligible, encryption helps ensure that private information sent over the internet stays private. Technology companies play a crucial role in keeping digital information safe. In this report, Amnesty International ranks 11 technology companies on whether they are meeting their human rights responsibilities by using encryption to protect users' right to privacy online. It focuses specifically on instant messaging services, such as Skype, WhatsApp and We Chat, which hundreds of millions of people around the world use to communicate every day.
