The worst embarrassing problem, that our country is confronted with nowadays, is not the economic crisis, but a potential crisis of human values towards "Man". A number of citizens still remain apathetic or indifferent towards the desperate refugees' "caravans" who arrive in our country by any means. **Immigrants** are

often not welcomed, unwanted, like burdens, threats to our easy life. In fact they are considered invaders. Just in the thought that these runners away, homeless people are going to become "a thorn in the Palm of our society" we go side by side with their persecutors.

Even if we realize that death stands behind and ahead of these distressed people, who

happened unexpectedly to have lost everything, their families, fortunes, friends, homes, a good life and their country, we are not willing to put aside our comfort and share part of our well-being with a little refugee child. We think selfishly and consider that keeping our standards of life untouched is a priority than considering dealing with human pain and distress worthwhile.

Families fall apart, kids are drawn and we still whistle indifferent, pretending that we don't realize what is happening around us, that it's not our business but Europe's. We just sit on our comfortable couch as onlookers, watching dead bodies coming out of the sea. We just protest and justify ourselves that we are in a difficult economic situation too, which is real but it cannot be an excuse to have such a behavior and stance.

But there are still human feelings and instincts in the majority of Greeks. Even if fences and barbed wire borders are raised, one thing is certain: our souls, the Greek souls are not going to be bound. Maybe the State cannot do a lot, but we, hundreds of Greeks, open our houses to the homeless, gather necessary items, food, medicine and clothing and along with NGOs try to relieve them.

Doctors offer their free service, teachers also visit daily the camps and try to occupy children and offer them joy and make them forget the difficult situation they are into. Even old ladies, forgetting their old age, try to offer a blanket and some food to refugee babies.

We, the pupils, feel the need to offer a little bit to this effort. It could us in their position. What then? Would we like to be treated worse than animals? Words are not enough. Selfless and practical expression of solidarity is urgently needed. Till Europe finds effective solutions, hundreds of refugees will lose their lives.

Perhaps the solution would be the great powers to find ways to stop the war that is destroying countries. Solidarity among nations should be developed before things reach the inevitable. "When your neighbor's home is burning, you have to expect that your own house is going to burn" writes Brecht.

Here is the real evidence of the Greek spirit quality: highlighting the aspect "voluntarism means offering, and offering is an ultimate proof of human quality, existence and dignity".

End of message

We, the Greek pupils, would like to send a message to our etwinning community too and to Europe.



We, teenagers, like having fun and enjoying our life.

We can't forget though that there other teenagers that have lost everything, their homes, their friends, their families, their schools, their countries. They walk miles in mud, soaked to the bone.

We stand by their side and show compassion to their misfortune. As we stand by those who lost their lives by terrorists in the same war.

We want to be heard by those who decide the fates of the people to make necessary negotiation and arrangements to stop the war.

Till then we show our sympathizing to all those who suffer because it reminds us the long caravans of our people being expelled from their homes again and again and of the caravans of people that run away because of Nasism. We don't want to see it happening again.

Your message is really beautiful. Do you personally open your house to immigrants?

Did your parents tell you about what happened during Nazism? Were they expelled or were they spectator of these injustices?

Anyway, we're very admirative of what you did for them. Where we live, we don't see poor people or migrants... They are in bigger cities like Paris.... So we can't do this. But, in general, when we see poor people, we give them some food or drinks.

Yes, our grandparents were immigrants from Minor Asia in Turkey. The same caravans we see today of the Syrians were then of Greeks who had to leave their homes and their home country where they lived in peace with the Turkish people and other tribes and people of other origin for hundreds or thousands of years. For the moment the refugees in Aigaleo are living in a great area which is formed to host them and we, pupils, try with the rest citizens to gather food and a list of necessary items for them, medicine, baby milk, nappies, blankets, toys and so on.
