<u>What caused the riot?</u>	Maria Hertogh was a Muslim and she was kneeling down to Virgin Mary. Many Muslims felt that their religion was being offended and disrespected. Then they started a riot between Islam and Christianity	The Anti-National Service Riots happened because local youths opposed compulsory military service introduced by the British colonial government. They saw it as unfair and as serving a colonial power that did not represent them.	the riot happened because bus workers faced poor pay and harsh working conditions. They were organized under the Singapore Bus Workers' Union, which the company refused to recognize, leading to tensions.	The Chinese middle school riots were caused by rising tensions between students and the colonial government. Authorities closed schools like Chung Cheng High School and arrested student leaders over suspected communist links. Students, already unhappy about unequal treatment of Chinese education, protested. When police intervened,

What happened during the riot?	During the Maria Hertogh riots in Singapore, large crowds gathered outside the courthouse after the court ruled that Maria Hertogh should return to her Dutch parents. The crowd became angry and protests turned violent. Rioting broke out in several parts of the city. Mobs attacked people, damaged vehicles, and set buildings on fire. Police and British troops were sent in to restore order. It resulted in	hundreds of Chinese educated students gathered near Government House to protest against compulsory military service. It began peacefully, with students marching and presenting petitions. Tensions rose when the police tried to disperse the crowd, leading to clashes. Students threw stones	bus workers went on strike to demand better pay and working conditions. Police tried to break up the strike, which led to clashes between the workers and the authorities. Some students joined to support the workers, and violence broke out, including fights and property damage. Several people were injured, and the streets around the Hock Lee Bus Company depot became chaotic as tensions escalated.	Chinese middle school students staged protests and sit-ins at schools such as Chung Cheng High School. Clashes broke out when police tried to disperse them, leading to street fighting, property damage, and arrests. The unrest spread to nearby areas, with students and authorities confronting each other until order was gradually restored.
