GUIDE AND DEFINE

Collaboration means working together with one or more people to make something or achieve something.

Why is such a simple skill so important to employers and success in the workplace?

RELEVANT TERMS

Shared goal: A clearly defined outcome that unites a team to reach it together
Teamwork: When a group of people work together to make a project better and to reach a shared goal
Common ground: When two or more people share the same ideas, skills, or purpose
Brainstorm: Process of generating ideas in order to solve a problem or reach a goal
Delegate: To share the tasks you need to complete to reach the goal rather than doing them all by yourself
Morale: The mental state of a group or individual when they need to complete a task
Setback: something that delays or prevents a process or goal from developing
Dispute resolution: A method of fixing a problem between two or more people

TRAIT 2

Can identify the process of completing a shared goal by identifying resources, timelines, objectives, and team members' skills to meet the shared goal successfully.

Essential Question:

How can I use the skills my team members and I have to reach our goal, while showing respect for the ways we are different?

Content Summary:

Successful collaboration requires identifying a common goal, knowing each member's skills, and organizing resources and timelines. Respecting diverse backgrounds and experiences is key.

Activity: Discuss teamwork and stages in team formation. Complete an [activity](#) on collaboration and planning a class fundraiser.

- Tell about a time when you were part of a team that had a clear common goal. How did this goal influence what you did to help the team?

TRAIT 3

Shares leadership and responsibilities with team members, offers help when needed, and involves team input to generate new ideas.

Essential Question:

How can I lead a team by including all members and using their strengths to achieve our shared goal?

Content Summary:

Effective leadership involves sharing responsibilities, offering help, and encouraging team input. Good leaders recognize the skills of their team members and delegate tasks accordingly.

Workplace Connection:

Example: Salinas Tamales: How does Eric use collaboration to reach goals? Why does collaborating with others matter for the success of your business/team?

Activity: Discuss effective strategies for team success and participate in a collaboration activity focusing on teamwork.

Career Journey:

Example: Daniel Garcia's Story: What are the characteristics of a team leader?

Activity: Watch the video and think about the difference between a leader and a boss.

Activity: Teacher Led [Activity](#) (Stop, Collaborate & Listen), will get your group up and moving around while they work to collaborate on a question and a final answer.

Tell Your Story:

- Tell about a time you exhibited leadership. What was your role and how did you use your leadership to ensure collaboration?

TRAIT 4

Finds positive ways to deal with conflict on the team; sees setbacks as a way to learn.

Essential Question:

How can I deal with conflict on the team in a manner that allows us to learn from setbacks?

Content Summary:

Handling conflicts and setbacks positively is crucial for effective collaboration. Teams need to address problems constructively and learn from their experiences to improve.

Workplace Connection:

Example: NIC Industries: How does Brian handle conflict and focus on shared goals?

Activity: Discussion. Think of a time when you worked through a conflict. How did it feel and how did you manage it?

Career Journey:

Example: EJ's Story: How does collaboration play a vital role in customer service?

Activity: Share a time when trouble collaborating led to a learning opportunity.

Tell Your Story:

- Tell about a time when having a clear plan helped you overcome problems and keep a project moving. How did you create and use this plan?
- Tell about a time you had to solve a conflict in your team. What did you do to fix the situation, and how did it help the team?
