## Sergeant at Arms (SAA) Contest Briefing

- 1. A week or two prior to the scheduled contest, the Chief Judge should email the Sergeant at Arms with details on the speech contests as well as attachments:
  - Date and time for the speech contest and specify which contest (Division, Area, Tall Tales, International, etc.)
  - Date and time the SAA should arrive for the judge's briefing
  - Location (physical address if in person and meeting link if virtual)
  - Attachments:
    - i. Form 1171 Speech Contest Rulebook (revised 06/2022)
  - Optional to include:
    - i. Speech Contest Resources: https://www.toastmasters.org/resources/speech-contests
    - ii. Speech Contest Tutorials:

  - Reminder to SAA:
    - i. Not allowed to be a SAA in the same contest in which they would be competing
    - ii. Must be a paid member
- 2. It is suggested to have two Sergeants at Arms for each contest; can be the same for each contest
- 3. In Person Contests:
  - Once the contest begins, the SAA will allow entrance or exit from the contest speaking room only during the minute of silence between contestants
- 4. Virtual Contests:
  - BEST PRACTICE: SAA should be given co-host duties
    - i. Help admit attendees to the meeting keeping in mind that once the contest has begun, only admit to the meeting during the minute of silence between contestants (never while a contestant is speaking)
    - ii. Can assist in muting participants as needed
    - iii. Can assist in assigning breakout rooms
    - iv. NOTE: SAA should have a list of all contestants and contest officials; if they are disconnected from the contest due to technical issues, they will need to be let back in immediately
      - 1. These individuals will be briefed that if they do come in outside the minute of silence to make sure they do not speak when connected
- 5. For the 2022-2023 Contest Speech Season, contestants may remain in the main speaking room for the entire contest for each speech contest
  - Additional instructions will be provided in the years where an Evaluation and/or Table Topics Contest will be held
