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Apprenticeship Convening





Great Work Happened in Illinois Bridges and ICAPS in FY23

In FY23, we had 198 approved Bridges (an increase of 13 from FY22) and 153 approved ICAPS (an increase of 31 from FY22). This all leads to more retention, more credentials, more transitions to post-secondary education, and definitely higher employment!

They already had plans in place and hopefully the Design Camp will help them better solidify those plans into a proposal that will be easily approved. Also, because of the great work that Sarah and Tara at SIPDC do, they were asked to participate in supporting programs that are participating this year in the Camp. Congratulations, SIPDC!!
