

Program Overview 2023-2024

Now, more than ever before, young adults in our community need role models, encouragement, and face-to-face interaction. Can you think of a mentor in your life who influenced your decisions, habits, or future for the better? You could be that mentor to a high school student! North Kansas City Schools is currently recruiting local business and community mentor volunteers who would like to share their time and wisdom with our students.

Our goal each year is to connect 11th grade students with a mentor volunteer who can guide their academic and career decisions. Mentors are carefully matched to small groups of two to three students (no more than 4 students). Mentors meet with students monthly on campus at their high school. All agendas, materials, and training are provided! See below for quick program facts and specific meeting dates and topics. Visit us on the web for more information.

Mentor-Student Session Details:

- **Commitment:** Mentors make an 8-month commitment: one meeting per month from October to May. It is important that mentors attend each and every session.
- **Session Topics:** Agendas for each meeting are pre-planned activities that focus on topics such as: SMART Goals, Academic Success, Action Planning, Career Planning, and Resume & Interview Skills.
- Location: Sessions are held at each of our four high schools, supervised by NKCS staff.
- **Dates:** Mentor monthly sessions are typically held on the 3rd Wednesday of each month. Exact dates are pre-scheduled and can be found on the next page as well as on our district website.
- **Times**: Sessions are each 60 minutes in length including mentor announcements prior to each student meeting. All meetings will occur from 10:30 a.m.-11:30 a.m.

Mentor Volunteer Steps to Apply:

- (2) **Complete Background Check** and **Fingerprints** prior to first meeting (details on web). *If you participated last year and we have your background check on file, you will not have to resubmit.*
- (3) Attend Mentor Orientation (choose one from dates below)
- (4) Match-up is done by NKC Schools staff who match you to a student group fitting your submitted profile
