Extrava is the newest continent, distant from all other regions, except for Ouen, which is an estimated hundred miles away. It was formed after Regigias' Continental Division, which is why it is so far from other landmasses. It was created during the Great War, when Kyogre shot a fierce blast of water at Groudon, sending it flying miles and miles across the sea. When it finally collided with the sea, its dry skin created Extrava itself.

Later during the war, humans entered as a factor. They viciously attacked Pokémon, and being the smarter ones, they usually won the fight. Cobalion, disappointed, took up consent with Arceus to bring all of the lesser Pokémon to Extrava as a safe haven. He allowed it, and they



were shipped over by the Lapras-full.

His comrade, Terrakion, created a rocky dome around Extrava to protect from enemies. Virizion stood outside the wall, attacking any oncoming hostiles. The other Pokémon roamed around the region freely. Taking to the skies, some of the island's lakes, or just scattered across the turf.

However, the Musketeers grew tired. As important as defending the lesser Pokémon was, they couldn't keep it up forever. Every mere misfire from the Elemental Trio's fierce battle tore gaping holes in the dome, causing rubble to topple off and crash into the ground, creating craters and small hills.

Mew looked at the sad situation, distressed that the fate of Pokémon-kind was falling in the wrong direction. It left its home and traveled to Extrava, and presented the Musketeers with their new leader, Keldeo- and not a moment too soon.

Entei, Suicune, and Raikou, who had been held hostage in a human base, were rescued by Ho-oh. The massive bird charred the entire tower, and removed the dogs from it. It was too late, however; masks had already been pressed permanently into their faces,



a symbol that would be forever seen as a mark of human dominance over Pokémon.

It rained fire for ten weeks, but Keldeo and Cobalion worked together to create a shield of metallic water to protect Extrava from any damage.

Meanwhile, the battle of elements raged on as powerful as ever. Arceus and Mew watched from above, concerned that the ritual might not ever end. In addition, there was the issue that the Musketeers might grow too tired to carry on. The world was not carrying on very well.

In response, he grievously created the elements of death, and gave Pokémon power, so if the Musketeers did grow tired, they could fend for themselves.

To guard the elements, he created Emravn, foreseer of the Underworld and Guardian of Death. He also created Mohacidon, resident of the Hall of Origin, and defender of the power of Pokémon.

Now realizing the risk of death, plus the



increased power provided by Mohacidon, the trio of weather quickly retreated into a deep slumber to recover under the Embedded Towers, where they would remain for a while longer.

After the bigger half of the aggressive tension was gone, the humans also lightened up a little, and were impressed with Pokémon's newfound power.

They began to ship in to Extrava, setting up small settlements. The dome collapsed, creating the region's mountains.

Eventually, the settlements grew to cities.

Keldeo remained in Extrava, never informed of the end of the war. It runs around the region, paranoid of the next strike by the enemy, not realizing that they have been asleep for more than a century.

Once the region was well off, an old research facility was built on the side of the mountain, conducting what they dubbed, "Project Echo." It involved using technology to implant extra knowledge into Pokémon's minds, but the leader, named Reno, was completely oblivious to the fact that this idea had been put in his mind by none other than Deoxys.

Two Trainers who were against the idea, named Raven



and Mohac, fought against Reno with every bit of power they had. When they rose to power as League Champions, they abolished the idea altogether, and had Reno put on Training probation.

Angry, he plotted revenge on the Champions. Because he could not battle himself, he formulated a group, Team Echo, to do his bidding for him. Team Echo mostly consisted of Pokémon whose minds had been told to do exactly what Reno said, using the technology he had used in his past research.

He planned to befriend Emravon and Mohacidon, and use their power to drain everyone else of their power, as well as take Pokémon from the underworld to use as his own slaves. Then, they would overcome the Pokémon League, and eventually, take over the entire planet.

However, the Legendary Pokémon were calmed before they could be lulled into the plan.

This is the creation story, as well as World History and the most important events in Extrava's history. Keep reading, and you will find that this fieldbook also contains other tales of Extrava.

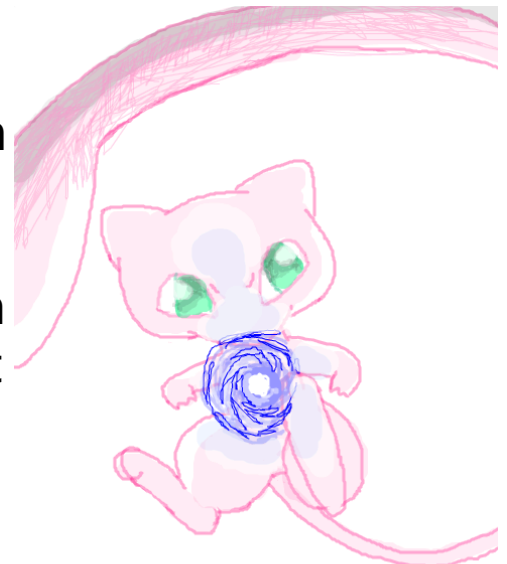
The Greed of Mohacidon

Mohacidon was the grand giver of power, depositing power into Pokémon as they were born, and withdrawing it as they died.

However, one day he found that he could also feed himself power, and could have unlimited strength. However, the transaction would take time. While adding strength to a normal Pokémon was a quick shot of power, adding power as immense as he had hoped for would take much longer, possibly years.

It went quite well for a while. It shot power into Pokémon being born, and took it from Pokémon dying. Arceus suspected nothing- however, Mew was not as foolish. As the ruler of all living creatures, it noticed an unusual amount of power going into newborn Pokémon; drastically higher than usual. It reported the change to Arceus, but it thought nothing of it. It was likely just a mistake.

At last, the transaction was complete. It was at full, maximum power. Slowly, he crept up on Arceus and viciously attacked. A Hyper Beam launched at him, knocking him down on the ground. Then an immensely powerful Flash Cannon smashed into it, further injuring it



beyond being able to get up.

Mew walked in on the scene, and quickly reacted by using Aura Sphere. While Mohacidon was stunned, it called in all of its legendary brethren, teaming up to destroy the rebel together.

However, Mohacidon proved victorious, and killed every other Pokémon that had attacked. It was quite weakened, nonetheless. The only survivor was Arceus, whom Mohacidon had forgotten about. While it was able, it charged all of its energy and attacked Mohacidon with Judgment.

Mohacidon fell to the ground, defeated. While it was fainted, Arceus locked it in the center of the world, where it was drained energy from to give to newborns. All of the legendaries it had killed were revived.

Divine Peak

Alder's parents and other ancestors were born in a small village on the side of a large mountain, known as Alpineville. Alpineville was the first settlement ever on Extrava, and housed the natives of the region, known as Programs. The Programs behaved much like the Native Americans of Earth, with a tribe head known as an, "Elite" (hence the term, "Elite Four," so named because Alder was the first champion, chronologically).

The Programs followed many ideals. They believed that nature was the giver of all life, and respected it strongly. Once a year, the Elite and a few chosen representatives would travel to the top of the mountain on which they lived to shower Celebi in gifts and offerings, thanking it for the bounty of the forest.

Arceus grew jealous of Celebi over time, envying its gifts and love from the Programs. It forced Mohacidon to drain Celebi of all power, and locked it away to the shrine in Ilex Forest.

The Programs were angry with Arceus, so they hatched a plan. They built a shrine to it, housed on the top of the mountain, called Divine Peak. They placed gifts and bountiful food for it to enjoy. While it blissfully ate, the villagers summoned Giratina to fight Arceus. Again angry that it had been deceived, it created the Distortion World,

where Giratina would suffer forever. It also destroyed the shrine to it, but released Celebi. From that point on, Arceus brought many curses upon the small village, but never again contacted them. Damos hailed from Alpineville.

Keldeo's Birth

Keldeo was born on an island located in the center of a circle of waterfalls, surrounded by mist. A light, beautiful drizzle always fell, and two radiant rainbows always hung in the sky. The island was tropical and lush with plant life; however, no Pokémon live there.

Keldeo was never informed of the war's ending, so it roamed the Extrava region, bracing for the next attack. However, should a Trainer come across it, it resorts to its birthplace, where it can transform to its Resolute Forme. Any Trainer that can meet it at its island is considered worthy, and Keldeo will engage it in battle.

Gameplay Story (Granite)

Player goes to the laboratory, and chooses their starter. In this game, the partner Pokémon can be selected, so any Pokémon, instead of just your starter, can be selected as a partner (you still have to get one of the basic starters, you can choose partner later).

The Pokémon first in the party walks behind the player. The Pokémon Professor, Professor Maple, requests that the player meet him at Bienaville, where he gives the player the basic walkthrough. Nurse Joy supplies player with basic needs, such as Trainer Card, PokéGear, running shoes (with manual, naturally), and five PokéBalls.

After this, the player meets rival; she rudely introduces herself, battles, then scurries off, apparently headed to
