Introduction:

National Monarchism is an ideology that harmonizes populism, traditionalism, militarism, nationalism, and the timeless values of the Empire of Ela'r'oech. I. Populism:

The Christian values of the Empire also are imperative to be taught to be people and the young generation of the Empire. The Lord is to be given praise and reverence ultimately. The Church of Ela'r'oech is to be reinstated with the Church unaffected and unthreatened by the party. So long as real Christian - specifically Catholic - values are taught then the church is absolutely within its right to practice and teach as it sees fit completely independently from the party and the state.

III. Militarism:

National Monarchism advocates for a powerful military as a bulwark against external threats, safeguarding the nation's sovereignty and protecting its citizens. A well-disciplined and technologically advanced armed forces stand as a symbol of strength and readiness.

IV. Nationalism:

National unity and pride form the cornerstone of this ideology. National Monarchism emphasizes the unique identity and exceptionalism of the Elarian nation, fostering a profound sense of patriotism and loyalty among its citizens. It celebrates national achievements and aims to instill a collective consciousness that transcends individual interests.

National Monarchists hold historical figures in high regard, almost to a legendary status. These individuals serve as role models, embodying the virtues and ideals of the Elarian people. The legacy of these figures is celebrated and revered, inspiring the nation to strive for greatness and honor their heritage.

V. Elarian Values:

Derived from the principles of the Empire of Ela'r'oech, National Monarchism promotes values such as honor, duty, loyalty, and reverence for historical figures. These values serve as the moral compass guiding the actions of the ruling monarchy and the supreme party, ensuring just and principled governance in line with Elarian tradition.

Loyalty is a fundamental value in National Monarchism. Citizens are encouraged to exhibit unwavering loyalty to the Lord, the Monarchy, the Chancellor, and the President, in that order of importance. Loyalty to family, the party, and the nation is also highly valued and is seen as an essential aspect of being a true Elarian.

VI. Monarchy:

Central to National Monarchism is the belief in the absolute legitimacy of the ruling monarchy. The monarchy, seen as the embodiment of the nation's soul, is entrusted with the sacred duty to guide and lead the Elarian people. The supreme party, an extension of the monarchy, is the exclusive and legitimate source of political power.

VII. The Party's Duty:

The ruling party, acting as the instrument of the monarchy, bears the solemn duty to guide and control the Elarian masses for the collective welfare of the nation. Formulating policies in line with Elarian values, the party ensures social harmony, maintaining the nation's strength and prosperity. Leading with wisdom, empathy, and an unwavering commitment to the citizens, the party charts the course for a prosperous and harmonious Elarian society.

VIII. Elarian Purity:

National Monarchists believe in the purity of the Elarian race, culture, and heritage. They view foreigners and, particularly, Pontunians as impure when compared to ethnic Elarians. This belief fuels a strong nationalist sentiment and drives the ideology's commitment to preserving the Elarian identity and safeguarding the nation's interests.

To clarify further, race is a concept with no biological or scientific basis or evidence. It's purely a social construct. The Elarian race could be defined by a simple citizen of the Empire who also, generally, speaks the language. Ideally, anyone can become a member of the race so long as they uphold and defend its values and the Empire itself. All foreigners should be free to join the Empire so long as they pass a test that evaluates their eligibility for citizenship. These foreigners will then be naturalized by their own volition in a program any non naturalized citizen can opt out of. However, naturalization will include taking courses on the language and history of the nation. Naturalized citizens are also then free to call themselves members of the race.

The race is only as superior as its members. Superior traits, as viewed by National Monarchism, would be a collective sense of loyalism, Traditionalist and Christian values, providing their abilities to the state for productivity by any means as they see fit. The race has traits that are referred to as superior. But superior in this context means simply 'better than they were before.'

The race should work to be superior every day. Superior to their past selves and superior to the mere citizens. Superior does not mean, in this context, better than any other 'races' because as previously explained, have no biological basis. Not only would it be hypocritical to claim otherwise, but it would also be exclusionary and therefore antithetical to National Monarchist ideals.

The Elarian race is not one of any very specific peoples, rather those who speak Elarian and live in the Empire. Those born unto ethnic Elarians are also viewed as members of the race, naturally. One can join the race, but not leave it.

To conclude and re-emphasize, the justifications for the race are that anyone can join it and that it isn't inherently based in science or biology. It's a self-identification that anyone can 'join.' The traits of the race are mostly simple belief systems that most members should try to uphold.

XI. Daily Life:

In the Empire of Ela'r'oech, a family of four leads a fulfilling daily life, deeply entwined with the nation's values and traditions. The father, a high-ranking official, starts his day by offering praise to the Emperor and his Chancellors for their wisdom and guidance.
